DECISION ON YOUR ACCESS APPLICATION

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (FOI Act) received by ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) on Wednesday 6 May 2020.

This application requested access to:

"All documents you have relating to your ruling regarding mandating flu vaccinations for workers, contractors and visitors to Aged Care Facilities from 1 May 2020, including double-blind placebo controlled peer review studies of the 2020 flu vaccines mandated showing their safety and efficacy."

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General of ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) under section 18 of the FOI Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act. ACTHD was required to provide a decision on your access application by **Thursday 4 June 2020**.

Decisions

The Public Health (Residential Aged Care Facilities) Emergency Direction 2020 (No 2) does not "mandate flu vaccinations". The Direction requires anyone entering or working in the facility to have had an influenza vaccine.

The Australian Health Protection Principal Committee (AHPPC), the expert public health decision-making committee to the Australian government during the COVID-19 epidemic, has advised that all residential aged care staff and visitors are required to be vaccinated against influenza from 1 May 2020 before entering a residential aged care facility. ACT, like all States and Territories, has issued a Public Health Direction, giving effect to that decision.

Ombudsman review
