#### **DECISION ON YOUR ACCESS APPLICATION**

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (FOI Act), received by ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) on **Friday 4 March 2022**.

This application requested access to:

- 'How many fatalities due to the Pfizer "vaccine" have there been in the ACT?
- How many adverse reactions to the Pfizer "vaccine" have there been in the ACT?
- How many fatalities due to any Covid "vaccine" have there been in the ACT?
- How many adverse reactions to any Covid "vaccine" have there been in the ACT?
- How many fatalities due to any non-Covid vaccine have there been in the ACT in the last 2 vears?
- How many fatalities due to any non-Covid vaccine have there been in the ACT in the last 50 years?'

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General of ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) under section 18 of the FOI Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act. ACTHD was required to provide a decision on your access application by **Monday 4 April 2022**.

#### **Decisions**

The Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) is the responsible agency for the collation and publication of COVID-19 vaccine safety information. The ACTHD is one of the organisations that provide the TGA with data which is relevant to the information you have requested. The ACTHD does not hold any additional information.

### **Ombudsman review**
