#### Dear Ms Coe

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act), received by the ACT Health on 20 April 2018, in which you sought:

"access to documents, procedures and guidelines relating to accreditation and loss of accreditation under the Australian Council on Healthcare Standards' National Safety and Quality Healthcare Standards for Canberra Hospital and Health Service."

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

ACT Health was required to provide a decision on your access application by 22 May 2018.

#### **Decision on access**

In accordance with section 43(1)(d) of the Act, I have decided to refuse to deal with your request as the information within the scope of your request is already publically available.

## Ombudsman review

My decision on your access request is a reviewable decision as identified in Schedule 3 of the Act. You have the right to seek Ombudsman review of this outcome under section 73 of the Act within 20 working days from the day that my decision is published in ACT Health's disclosure log, or a longer period allowed by the Ombudsman.
