

Further to our conversation just now, I note that the person who had carriage of this process and who provided the secretariat to the panel is not in the office today, but will be back on Monday. However, my understanding from our conversations (and I specifically asked Q1 myself) is:

- 1. In relation to the recommendations, the third rated provider was not recommended because the panel selected respondent so that they achieved the geographical allocation as per the election commitment, as well as a sharing of the funding across multiple providers. In addition, the lower rated provider was recommended by the advisory panel because they had a unique client mix meaning that the grant would meet unmet need for a target population. This is set out in the panel's report. Pat has asked me to note also that this was an advisory panel only and the Minister may, if she chooses, make a different decision.
- I received assurances yesterday that all of the panel completed conflict of interest declarations and while they

#### Background

- In 2016, the ACT Government made an election commitment to deliver a grant scheme
  to support the establishment of bulk billing general practices in the ACT. The 2017–18
  ACT Budget announced \$1.05 million over three years for the 'Better care when you
  need it—support for bulk billing GPs' initiative.
- Under MIN17/660, you agreed that:
  - ACT Health would manage a public tender process inviting general practice groups with a demonstrated commitment to bulk billing to submit applications for grant funding under this budget initiative.
  - Funding for the grant could all be awarded in one year, or that varied amounts could be awarded over more than one year, depending on the content and quality of the applications received.
  - Funding could be withheld from being awarded if applications were not deemed suitable.

#### Issues

- 3. The grant round opened on 12 February 2018, and closed on 6 April 2018, with 13 applications received, requesting a total of \$4,215,717.
- Applications were of varying quality, with some applications providing more comprehensive information than others.

#### **Grants Process**

5. The process for the set up and running of the Grant Fund included: development of the grant guidelines in consultation with key stakeholders; advertising of the grant fund via print, web, email lists and key publications; and assessment of the applications by a panel including ACT Health and key stakeholders. Further details are at <u>Attachment B</u>.

#### Assessment panel process and recommendations

- The assessment panel comprised five members: Ms Toni Ashmore, A/g Senior Manager (at the time), Policy and Stakeholder Relations Branch, ACT Health (Chair); Assoc Prof Katrina Anderson, Academic Unit of General Practice, ACT Health; Dr Antonio Di Dio, AMA ACT; Ms Kate Gorman, HCCA; and Ms Julie Porritt, CHN.
- Assessment panel members individually assessed and scored the eligible applications, against the eight selection criteria which were detailed in the Grant Fund funding guidelines.
- 8. The assessment panel members' individual scores were used as an initial basis for ranking the applications, all of which were then further discussed at the assessment panel meeting. The final assessment panel meeting minutes are at <u>Attachment C</u>.
- The assessment panel agreed to recommend two applications for funding as they both scored highly against the selection criteria and were of high quality and value. These were: Interchange General Practice (IGP)—\$500,000 excluding GST; and Isabella Plains Medical Centre (Isabella Plains)—\$111,244 excluding GST.

#### ACT Health review of recommendations

- The outcomes from the assessment panel are recommendations only, and may be accepted as is, or used to inform the final decision.
- 11. The ACT Government's election commitment was for three practices, two in Tuggeranong and one in the Molonglo Valley. In the initial ranking of the applications, based on the assessment panel's individual scoring at <a href="Attachment D">Attachment D</a>, it can be seen that prior to the assessment panel's group discussion, the highest ranked applications, in order of merit, came from IGP (one application), National Health Co-op (NHC) (three applications), and Isabella Plains (one application). It is therefore recommended that the three most highly ranked applicants be funded (rather than just two) to meet the election commitment.
- 12. ACT Health has sought further information from some applicants to supplement information provided in the applications, and in line with the assessment panel's recommendations and initial ranking of the applications, it is recommended to fund the following:
  - IGP to establish a practice in Tuggeranong at \$500,000 excluding GST (funding will
    cover the complete fit-out for the proposed new seven to eight room general
    practice).
  - NHC to establish a practice in Coombs at \$350,000 excluding GST (funding will
    cover part of the establishment and fit-out costs for the proposed new eleven
    room general practice).
  - Isabella Plains to extend their practice in Tuggeranong at \$111,244 excluding GST (funding will cover renovations and fitout to improve access for vulnerable and less able groups to two practice rooms; medical equipment; upgraded IT systems; and IT equipment to support outreach, home visits and visits to residential aged care facilities).
- 13. Brief descriptions of all three proposals are at <u>Attachment E</u>, with more details available at <u>Attachment F</u>.

## Financial Implications

14. Total funding available for the Bulk Billing General Practices Grant Fund was announced as \$1.05 million over three years. If all three proposals are funded, a total of \$961,244 excluding GST will be committed. A separate briefing will be provided to you on the use of the remaining \$88,756 (excluding GST) to understand and support bulk billing arrangements across the ACT.







#### Process to establish and run the Bulk Billing General Practices Grant Fund

- The Health Policy Unit, Strategic Policy Branch, ACT Health, considered options and briefed you on a possible way forward for the implementation of the 2016 election commitment to establish a grant fund to secure three new bulk billing general practices in Molonglo and Tuggeranong. You approved that the grant would be flexible, to allow all funding to be expended at once if several strong proposals were received, or for the funding to be expended over three years (or not at all) if only a few or no strong applications were received (MIN17/660).
- The grant guidelines were developed through two rounds of consultation with key stakeholders: the Health Care Consumers' Association (HCCA); the Australian Medical Association (AMA) ACT; and the Capital Health Network (CHN).
- 3. The grant fund was advertised in *The Canberra Times* and in key publications of the CHN and AMA ACT, and on the ACT Health website. The CHN and the ACT Health GP Liaison Unit (GPLU) also sent emails to all general practices in the ACT, via their email lists, alerting them to the grant fund (most practices should therefore have been alerted by email twice). Advertisements and alerts directed potential applicants to the ACT Health website which included information on how to apply and the grant guidelines.
- The grant fund was opened on 12 February 2018, timed so that you could make the announcement.
- Application was by emailed submission to an inbox set up solely for the purpose, in Strategic Policy Branch. The inbox was monitored and receipt of applications acknowledged.
- 6. The grant round closed on 6 April 2018, as stipulated in the guidelines.
- 7. Strategic Policy Branch assessed the eligibility of applications. Applications would only be deemed ineligible if, for example, the application was submitted after the closing date and time; or the application was for something clearly not eligible for funding under the grant guidelines. All applications were deemed eligible.
- 8. A panel was assembled to undertake the assessment of the applications. Panel members were from ACT Health and key stakeholder organisations: Ms Toni Ashmore, previous A/g Senior Manager, Policy and Stakeholder Relations Branch, ACT Health (Chair); Assoc Prof Katrina Anderson, Academic Unit of General Practice, ACT Health (as a GP); AMA ACT; AMA ACT; HCCA; and CHN. Panel members were not affiliated with any of the general practices that were applying for the grants. Confidentiality agreements were signed by members.
- 9. The panel assessed the applications against the criteria in the grant guidelines. Panel assessed and ranked the applications individually first, then there was a group meeting on 2 May 2018 to discuss and agree to final recommendations, which form the basis of the Options for funding, for your consideration.

# New grants to bring more bulk billing to Canberra's south

The ACT Government is providing three general practices with grants that will enable them to expand services and invest in infrastructure to improve access to high quality, primary health care in the south of Canberra.

Minister for Health and Wellbeing Meegan Fitzharris today announced that more than \$961,000 in funding has been awarded to the Interchange General Practice, the Isabella Plains Medical Centre, and the National Health Co-op to make it easier for Canberrans to find a local bulk billing doctor on the Southside.

"The Interchange General Practice will use its grant to establish a new practice in Canberra's south with a focus on providing bulk billed primary health care services to vulnerable people in our community," Minister Fitzharris said.

"They are planning to build a seven to eight room practice that will deliver up to 35,000 consultations per year when fully staffed, making a significant contribution to primary healthcare in the ACT.

"The Isabella Plains Medical Centre will use its grant to upgrade its premises to improve access for clients with a disability and to expand its bulk billed offering.

"Two rooms near the front entrance of the practice will be refurbished to allow for ease of access and improve the privacy for patients. They will also purchase equipment for use at outreach clinics and home visits, extending the centre's remote care capabilities.

"The National Health Co-op will use its grant to establish a bulk-billed, multidisciplinary general practice medical clinic in the Molonglo Valley. This will expand the number of not-for-profit, member owned National Health Co-op clinics to nine, increasing access to residents in south-west Canberra.

"These projects will make it easier for Canberrans to find a local doctor who provides high quality, bulk billed clinical care and a local practice for coordinated primary health care services when they need it, regardless of their personal circumstances," Minister Fitzharris said.

The Bulk Billing General Practice Grant Fund was launched in February 2018, and committed \$1.05 million over three years from the 2017–18 budget to improve access to bulk billed primary health care services in Molonglo and Tuggeranong. There was a strong level of local interest and thirteen applications were received.



#### Background

- In 2016, the ACT Government made an election commitment to deliver a grant scheme
  to support the establishment of bulk billing general practices in the ACT. The 2017–18
  ACT Budget announced \$1.05 million over three years for the 'Better care when you
  need it—support for bulk billing GPs' initiative.
- The Bulk Billing General Practices Grant Fund was opened on 12 February 2018, and closed on 6 April 2018, with 13 applications received.
- Under MIN18/1154, it was recommended that you support funding for three applications to the grant fund. Between the three applications, total funding of \$961,244 excluding GST was requested, leaving \$88,756 excluding GST unexpended.

#### Issues

- 4. The remaining \$88,756 excluding GST is not sufficient to run a second round of the grant fund. Additionally, the first round of the grant fund will deliver on the election commitment to provide more bulk billed general practice services in Tuggeranong and Molonglo.
- It is proposed that the remaining grant funds be utilised to undertake a project to
  investigate options to improve the accessibility of primary health care for consumers,
  and to support bulk billing in the ACT.
- 6. The ACT Government has already undertaken a range of programs to boost bulk billing in the ACT by focusing on attempting to increase the GP-to-population ratio, and subsidising primary health care for the most vulnerable population groups. These programs have been successful, and according to Medicare statistics, GP bulk billing rates in the ACT have slowly climbed from 50.9 per cent in the March quarter of 2009, to 62.8 per cent in the June quarter of 2018. The national average, for the June quarter of 2018, was 85.6 per cent.
- 7. This new project will be informed by, and build on this previous activity. It is proposed that ACT Health fund the Capital Health Network to identify and investigate ways to continue to improve bulk billing and affordability of primary care health services in the ACT.

## **Financial Implications**

8. Under MIN18/1154, it was recommended that you support funding for three applications to the grant fund. Between the three applications, total funding of \$961,244 excluding GST was requested, leaving \$88,756 excluding GST unexpended. This remaining funding must be used or returned to consolidated revenue.
