

Parking infringements

If you receive a parking infringement while parked on the hospital grounds, you can apply for a review of the infringement through the Infringement Review Office via this link. <https://www.accesscanberra.act.gov.au>

Further information can be found on the back of your parking infringement notice or from the Access Canberra Contact Centre 13 22 81.

If you receive a parking infringement and you want to dispute the fine, you can ask for a certificate of attendance from the area where you had your appointment. This can be used as evidence when disputing the parking infringement.

You can access the Southern Multi-storey car park from Bateson Road. This car park is open 7 days a week.

| Level | Time limit |
|---------|----------------------------|
| Level 1 | 1 hour |
| Level 2 | 2 hours and permit parking |
| Level 3 | 4 hour |
| Level 4 | 6 hours and all day |

Make sure you check signs carefully as time limits on parking spaces are enforced.

You can access free 4 hour and all day parking at the Yamba South car park opposite Canberra Hospital.

1 hour parking spaces are located around the campus close to entrances.



Canberra Hospital provides several car parks for patients, carers and visitors across the hospital campus. Parking ranges from all day, untimed regulated parking, to timed parking and drop off areas.

Mobility parking

- Mobility parking is available on:
- levels 1, 2, 3 and 4 of the Southern Multi-storey car park;
 - behind National Capital Private Hospital;
 - beneath Building 12;
 - at entrances to the Centenary Hospital for Women and Children, Pathology and the Emergency Department.

Please note: A number of mobility spaces are time limited and time limits are enforced by Parking Officers under the Road Transport (Safety and Traffic Management) Regulation 2000.

Mobility spaces in the Southern Multi-storey car park are not time limited. If you are coming to Canberra Hospital for a long time, we suggest you park here and catch the courtesy bus to your appointment.

Drop off and set down parking is available at all hospital entrances.

Courtesy Bus

The Courtesy Bus operates on the hospital grounds on a continuous 15 minute loop from 8am-5pm Monday to Friday, excluding public holidays. This service is free and is provided to transport patients, visitors and staff between convenient pick up and drop off points:

- Emergency Department,
- Canberra Region Cancer Centre,
- Southern Multi-Storey Car Park,
- Main Hospital Entrance, and
- Centenary Hospital for Women & Children.

Patients delayed with treatment

Arrangements are in place to help patients and carers who overstay their parking time due to unforeseen delays. If you are unexpectedly delayed, please speak with a staff member in the area where you are having your appointment before your parking time runs out. They will let Canberra Health Services Parking Operations know you have been delayed.
