Surgical Procedures Interventional Radiology and Emergency (SPIRE) and Centenary Hospital for Women and Children (CHWC) Expansion key decisions

During our quarterly catch up on 10 December 2018, and in order to assist the ACT Helath Directorate you requested for Commercial Services and Infrastructure (CSI) to provide you with early notification of any challenges forseen in the beginning of 2019. As a consequence Infrastructure Finance and Capital Works (IFCW) have outlined a number of key decisions required from ACT Health Directorate (ACT HD) to direct IFCW in the delivery of SPIRE and the CHWC Expansion projects.

As you are aware, IFCW are currently supporting ACT HD in the delivery of 2018/19 business cases for SPIRE and CHWC Expansion to be completed in April and March 2019 respectively. The Minister for Health and Wellbeing announced in December 2018 the commencement of demolition of the Canberra Hospital Building 5 and 24 in the 2019 calendar year with completion of SPIRE in 2024.

To achieve these briefed milestone dates, there is much planning and work to be mobilised immediately. IFCW have developed a detailed project programme outlining key activities to be completed and are working closely with the Building Health Services Program team to meet the briefed commitments.

To progress according to programme, IFCW seek timely direction on a number of key matters as follows:

CHWC Expansion

1. Adolescent Mental Health Unit

A formal instruction to include an Adolescent Mental Health Unit into the business case scope including provision of an approved Health Planning Unit Brief and Model of Care is required. The CHWC Expansion Proof of Concept is well advanced and the inclusion of additional scope at a late stage will become problematic and may incur

abortive works, additional costs and programme delays. These documents are required in the first half of January 2019.

2. Ronald MacDonald House

Confirmation on the use of the existing Ronald MacDonald House floor plate for clinical use including the intended use, and schedule of accommodation is required. At present the use of this area is contested by clinical area leads and there are likely to be issues with its late inclusion into the business case scope. Again this may lead to abortive effort, additional costs, rework of the design and programme delays.

SPIRE

1. Governance Structure

Implementation of a governance framework early in January 2019 is critical to ensure a robust, transparent decision structure at appropriate levels in the organisation. IFCW recommend implementation of a PCG for each project and a combined CHWC Expansion and SPIRE Executive Steering Committee as the approving forum. The CHWC Expansion design is progressing at pace to meet the business case timelines and a governance structure is required to provide organisational accountability.

2. User Group Nominations

IFCW have provided User Group representative nominations to ACT HD which require rapid approval to enable date claimers for user group meeting to be scheduled in early 2019. IFCW are receiving negative feedback that SPIRE user group and start up meetings have not been diarised. A delay in establishing these meetings will attract further negative feedback from key stakeholderchas regarding their engagement through the design development process.

3. Accommodation and Relocations Strategy

There is a critical need to determine the accommodation and relocation strategy for SPIRE. With the demolition of Buildings 5 and 24 and a complex relocations programme required for both SPIRE and CHWC Expansion it is paramount that the accommodation strategy be agreed in the first quarter of 2019. Alternative accommodation is required for the

- o Child at Risk Unit (CARHU)
- o Sexual Health Clinic (SHC)
- Overnight accommodation
- o CHS executives offices
- Medical staff accommodation
- o Public car parking and executive/fleet carparking
- o CHWC administrative accommodation
- o Clinical decanting spaces for CHWC

The relocations strategy is likely to require construction of temporary accommodation on campus which will require planning approvals, design, construction, decanting and commissioning prior to demolition commencement.

4. Demolition Scope

To achieve demolition commencement in the 2019 calendar year as announced, a demolition DA will be required to be lodged before May 2019. An instruction to the Proof of Concept Principal Consultant Silver Thomas Hanley (STH) is required to develop the decanting strategy and demolition documentation package. IFCW require a formal instruction and Statement of Requirements in January 2019 to progress this work.

5. Service Delivery Plan

The development of the SPIRE Service Delivery Plan is required to inform a Principal Consultant and Contractor on the full scope, function and workflow of SPIRE which typically requires up to 12 months to prepare. IFCW seek a Statement of Requirements from ACT HD in January 2019 to commence procurement of a suitable health planning consultant to complete this deliverable.

6. Engagement and Communications Strategy

Prior to Demolition DA lodgement, it is highly recommended that detailed communication and engagement is undertaken by ACT HD with Canberra Health Services, external stakeholders, Unions, neighbours and the broader community. IFCW are able to coordinate key submissions from the Principal Consultant Team to inform this engagement strategy including, artist's impressions, sections and elevations of the SPIRE proposal. Absence of consultation will likely delay demolition DA lodgement.

7. Team Resourcing Model

The IFCW project delivery team is expanding to meet the current work load. Executive Director of Major Projects Mr Lloyd Esau will formally commence his leadership of the IFCW delivery team from January 2019. IFCW are keen to map a combined IFCW, ACT HD and CHS delivery team for the projects. Some initial thoughts have been provided in George Tomlins' correspondence (3 December 2018) to Karen Doran. This planning must include a discussion on a SPIRE/CHWC co-located team accommodation proposal.

I look forward to discussing these matters further to ensure decisions can be progressed in a timely manner to enable IFCW to support ACT HD in the delivery of these critical capital works initiatives to meet government expectations.

Capital Works Management Fees

I am writing regarding the capital works management fees payable by the Health Directorate to Infrastructure Finance and Capital Works (IFCW) in the current financial year.

The acting Executive Director IFCW, Mr George Tomlins, responded to your letter of 4 September 2018 on my behalf (3 December 2018), with the response provided to the Deputy Director General, Ms Doran. Pending the provision of formal advice, as requested from Ms Doran, regarding the division of responsibilities for capital works project delivery between Health and Canberra Health Services, I will continue to address matters related to fees directly with you as the recipient of the first tranche IFCW fee invoice in September 2018.

As set out in my letter to you of July 2018, the Government agreed (17/238/BUD – April 2017) that management fees would be payable to IFCW in usual circumstances. The decision was made to support the appropriate level of resourcing for IFCW's capital works delivery capability. More specifically, the Budget Process Rules (BPRs) clarify that the services of IFCW should be used in project delivery and that payment of fees would be mandatory. In unusual circumstances, exemptions from these arrangements would be assessed in the context of the Government's decision and the BPRs with my agreement as Under Treasurer.

I am advised that the first invoice for the Health Directorate's capital works fees, of \$2.153m (GST ex), is currently some 30 days past due and remains unpaid at the time of writing. I would be grateful for your earliest attention to settling this matter.

As Mr Tomlins set out in his letter, IFCW remains committed not only to high standards of service, expertise and accountability, but also to adjusting the second fee invoice to take account of prepayments and other cost adjustments. I am advised at this stage that the second invoice, to be rendered in February 2019, is expected to be in the region of \$0.968m.

IFCW's considerable expertise is available to all directorates as and when required and I encourage you to discuss your future project delivery requirements as soon as possible in preparation for the delivery of the 2019-20 capital works program. Follow up from meeting with Royal Australasian College of Surgeons, 17 September 2018

I refer to my letter of 18 October 2018, to which we have not received a response.

Last week the ACT Minister for Health announced the new Surgical Procedures, Interventional Radiology and Emergency (SPIRE) Centre will be built on the same location earmarked for a skills training centre, which we discussed with you in September.

You may not be aware of the timeline associated with this priority for surgical training, but conversations with your predecessor date back to September 2015. More than three years on, despite multiple assurances that a space will be identified for the centre (a surgical training post accreditation requirement), no progress has been made.

RACS ACT has provided detail on the design and fit out requirements on multiple occasions. At our September meeting the Deputy Director-General of Canberra Hospital & Health Services Chris Bone and former Chief Medical Officer Jeff Fletcher committed to making at least two rooms available within one month.

The requirements for a Medical Education and Support Officer to deliver surgical training and education were outlined in our 2016 proposal, and in September we also asked whether ACT Health would support this position, similar in job description to the 0.5 FTE staff specialist position responsible for enhancing physician training and education in the ACT, and broader southern NSW catchment.

Just finally, we seek an update on the Clinical Leadership Forum announced by the Minister on 10 September 2018, as part of her statement on ACT Health Culture. We hope you can provide an update on these two issues very soon.

Surgical Procedures, Interventional Radiology and Emergency (SPIRE) Centre, Expansion of Centenary Hospital for Women and Children (CHWC) and Infrastructure Finance and Capital Works (IFCW)

Thank you for your letter of 2 January 2019 in relation to Capital Works Management Fees. I also acknowledge correspondence from Mr Shaun Strachan and Mr George Tomlins of 21 December 2018 and 3 December 2018 respectively.

On 1 October 2018, ACT Health was split and commenced transition to two separate Directorates – the ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) and Canberra Health Services (CHS). Attached to the letter from Mr Tomlins was a draft anticipated fee reconciliation from Infrastructure Finance and Capital Work's (IFCW), for current capital appropriations for both ACTHD and CHS projects. Following the transition, I can confirm the following appropriations are under the auspices of ACTHD:

- #6: Better healthcare for a growing community Surgical Procedures, Interventional Radiology and Emergency Centre (SPIRE);
- #10: Better care when you need it Surgical Procedures, Interventional Radiology and Emergency Centre (SPIRE);
- #12: Better healthcare for a growing community Expanding Centenary Hospital More services for women and children;
- #14: Better care when you need it Planning for healthcare in Canberra's north
- #16: Ngunnawal Bush Healing Farm;
- #20: Better healthcare for a growing community Continuing North side health
- #24: Better care when you need it Expanding Centenary Hospital More services for women and children; and
- #26: Bowes Street Fit Out.

In regard to item #4 (Better Infrastructure Fund), a portion of this relates to Calvary Public Hospital Bruce (CPHB). In this respect, there will be a quantum of ownership for this project that will reside with the ACTHD – i.e. the CPHB portion of the project. I note that as a grant to a third party, it is not anticipated that this will attract a fee for IFCW services.

For the projects listed above, ACTHD agrees with the IFCW reconciliation, and anticipates invoices totalling \$931,000 for the 2018-19 financial year. To this end, I would appreciate if you could reissue the August 2018 invoice for ACTHD consistent with our project portfolio (\$466,000). I note that where there are rollovers for these projects in 2019-20 and beyond, that the 2018-19 payment will need to be recognised for the future years to avoid duplication of fees.

Expansion of the Centenary Hospital for Women and Children (CHWC)

The ACTHD is currently working with IFCW and CHS on the Proof of Concept design for the Expansion of the CHWC,

The project includes Adolescent Mental Health Unit a

Detailed health planning unit (HPU) briefs are close to completion and will be provided shortly through to the design team.

The ACTHD has also recently implemented a governance structure for project, which includes IFCW, consistent with the ACT Government Capital Framework. A copy of the governance structure has been provided to IFCW and we look forward to working with IFCW to successfully deliver to completion this critical project.

SPIRE project would be overseen by a governance group chaired by the ACTHD with cross-government representation of which we envisage IFCW will be a key stakeholder.



The other matters relating to SPIRE raised in your letter of 21 December 2018, including planning and developing a strategic approach for Development Application lodgement, are being progressed by the ACTHD in partnership with IFCW. I would like to thank you and your team for the support we have received in progressing workshops this week and assisting us to remain on track to deliver against the Government's commitments.

I very much welcome further discussion with you on these projects and matters should this be required, and look forward to the continued support of IFCW to progress ACTHD capital projects in a timely manner and within Government's expectations.

Surgical Procedures, Interventional Radiology and Emergency Centre – Planning and Engagement

ACT Health has commenced site planning for the new Surgical Procedures, Interventional Radiology and Emergency Centre (SPIRE) at Canberra Hospital, Garran.

As discussed with you in December, the new SPIRE Centre will encompass land on which buildings 5 and 24 are currently located on the Canberra Hospital campus. These structures will need to be removed to accommodate the new building.

To support the 'staging and decanting' phase of the SPIRE project, we have commenced scoping existing services and functions currently housed in these buildings and identifying relocation options. I would like to work with you to determine the best approach to identifying decanting options for ANU Medical School staff and activities currently located in building 5, and the appropriate timing of relocation works.

In relation to the ANU's activities in Building 5, I understand that there is some capacity in Building 4 which could be activated by minor works. Improved utilisation of the ANU Medical School building would also be consistent with the site's Strategic Asset Management Plan and sustainability goals. ACT Health would be happy to work with your team to explore this potential utilisation as part of the SPIRE project.

Identifying mechanisms for effectively communicating with ANU staff and students affected by these works is also a priority for the SPIRE project team.

I invite you, or your representative/s, to participate in the proposed Building 5 Staging and Decanting Working Group. The Working Group will provide advice on the staging and decanting strategy and input into the final recommendations put to the SPIRE Project Steering Committee for endorsement.

It is anticipated that the first meeting of the Working Group will be held February 2019, and a schedule of meeting dates and agenda will follow.

Thank you for your letter of 21 December 2018 regarding the skills training centre. I apologise for the delay in responding.

As you are aware, the new Surgical Procedures, Interventional Radiology and Emergency (SPIRE) Centre will displace existing buildings 24 and 5 on the hospital campus. This development requires our Strategic Infrastructure branch to undertake staging and decanting planning for the services and staff operating from these buildings, including identifying alternative accommodation arrangements on either a short, or longer-term basis.

Opportunities to accommodate the proposed surgical skills training space on the Canberra Hospital campus may be considered in the context of these accommodation requirements.

In relation to your request for an update on the Clinical Leadership Forum, I can advise that the ACT Government will shortly be seeking Expressions of Interest from interested health professionals who want to contribute to shaping the future of public health services in the ACT.

I understand the pressures on families who travel to Canberra for care and am committed to ensuring those who need it will have access to appropriate accommodation support.

ACT Health Directorate is planning for the construction of the new Surgical Procedures, Interventional Radiology and Emergency (SPIRE) Centre on the Canberra Hospital campus. The new centre will improve and support the continued delivery of timely and high quality services at the hospital as well as cater for the ACT's growing population by bringing more and better tertiary health services to Canberra Hospital. SPIRE will increase the hospital's capacity to deliver acute and emergency health care to residents of Canberra and the surrounding region.

The site for the new SPIRE Centre encompasses land currently occupied by buildings 5 and 24. Building 5 residences will continue to be accessible until the end of 2019 for interstate visitors and carers of patients who live more than 100km from Canberra Hospital.

ACT Health Directorate is currently working in collaboration with Canberra Health Services (CHS) to develop alternative arrangements to meet the accommodation needs of the families of interstate patients from 2020. Any new arrangements for CHS accommodation policies for patients and carers travelling long distances to receive treatment, will be in line with those of other large public hospitals around the country and engagement with people who require the service will take place closer to the end of the year.

have just been listening to Chief Ministers talkback on ABC radio and noted that the Chief Minister stated that the proposed location of the Canberra Hospital SPIRE project is the only location available for this project.

As a long time Canberra resident and frequent user of the hospital, I am pleased that funding is being made available to improve the facility however, I would like to know:

- What other options were considered when choosing the location?
- Did you look at options to expand the campus footprint (e.g. the other side of Yamba drive or next to Garran oval where temporary carparks exist)?
- When has the precinct masterplan been circulated and what consideration has been given to traffic flows, impact on residents (particularly Harpur St residents), impact on Garran Primary School and noise impact of the helicopter pad being moved even closer to nearby homes?
- Does the site meet the standards for accessibility to an Emergency health facility both for ambulance, air ambulance and the general public?

I consider that due process has not been followed in regard to the location of this project. I live in Garran and only received a flyer showing the location a few weeks ago.

Andrew Barr's response this morning showed a level of arrogance that I don't expect from elected members who are there to serve their constituents, not just sweep very real concerns under the carpet which is exactly what Andrew did this morning.

This is not a NIMBY response from local residents – it is a response to something that clearly has not been fully considered (e.g. – Barr stating yes we will look into traffic issues etc – surely this should be done before making a decision!).

Nobody is saying that this project should not go ahead – but follow due process, develop a full, multi-year precinct plan before plonking it on a site just because it happens to be available, even though it clearly has many issues and, I suspect, may not meet emergency access standards.

Canberra is not Kogorah or Camperdown – we have vacant land adjacent to Canberra hospital which, with a bit of thought could be incorporated into the hospital campus to make it a more pleasant and accessible campus for all that use it now and into the future and have the added bonus of limiting the impact for Canberra residents who live close to the facility.

I look forward to your response.

Dear Ms Stephen-Smith

Thankyou for your letter directed to Garran Residents re the SPIRE Project at The Canberra Hospital.

In your letter, you states that the "current facilities at the north-eastern part of The Canberra Hospital campus already generate traffic flow from Gilmore Cres and Palmer Street..." and that relocation of services will result in "...traffic flow [being] directed to other parts of The Canberra Hospital... [which] will offset other traffic movements associated with the SPIRE project".

I am concerned that you have been given inaccurate information about the traffic flow at The Canberra Hospital. Currently the carpark at the north-eastern part of the campus is only accessed via Hospital Rd, and the service in the buildings to be demolished are only accessed via Hospital Rd. None of these areas are access by either Gilmore Cres or Palmer Street.


Part of the SPIRE plans discussed at a recent staff information session indicated that a lot of the services from the demolished buildings will be moving to a new (demountable) building at the site of the current Building 8 which is accessed via Palmer Street. This will result in a movement of traffic on to Palmer Street in addition to traffic from the SPIRE.

I have attached a map that shows this.

Traffic for the SPIRE needs to be urgently addressed, particularly any implications for safety of primary school children at Garran Primary considering the type of traffic that an Emergency Department is likely to generate. If the SPIRE site cannot be moved, then significant traffic flow changes (such as blocking off Palmer Street at the Gilmore Cres end so all SPIRE traffic is via Palmer Street not past the school on Gilmore Street) need to be considered.

The ACT Government is committed to engaging with both our near neighbours and the greater ACT community to deliver a fit for purpose, state of the art facility that will provide vital services for our community, well into the future.


The ACT Government is very mindful of traffic pressures within the Canberra Hospital precinct and is keen to work with the community, including Garran Primary School and local residents, to address these as part of the broader planning process. Our traffic engineers are currently evaluating the traffic volumes and flow in and around the hospital campus. This will allow the design team for the project to better understand the impacts on the traffic network of the local area before any design decisions are finalised.

You are correct that the existing carparking that will be displaced by SPIRE is accessed off Hospital Road, however, it is our current understanding that most of this traffic gains access to Hospital Road via Gilmore Crescent at the northern end of the campus. We expect that the additional traffic studies we are undertaking will confirm this.

In relation to the new Building 8, I would like to assure you that this new facility will be accessed primarily by foot from Hospital Road and is only being used to relocate functions that are already on site. The new building will include parking accessed from Palmer Street, but the quantity of this parking will not be materially different to that which is currently provided in this location (between buildings 8 and 9 and behind building 9). As such, it is not expected that this development will have any effect on traffic volumes – either on Palmer Street or at the hospital generally.

This is just the start of the conversation, and through community interest groups, information forums, and online at YourSay there will be ongoing opportunities for further community input.
