DECISION ON YOUR ACCESS APPLICATION

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (FOI Act) received by Canberra Health Services (CHS) on Thursday 9 January 2020.

This application requested access to:

"All Canberra Health Services and/or ACT Health internal correspondence between/to and from executive level staff or clinical heads of departments from November 20 to the date of FOI acknowledgment relating to:

- smoke haze in Canberra Hospital or other health facilities.
- availability of P2 masks in Canberra
- smoke related ED admissions

AND All briefing notes prepared on the smoke haze, P2 mask availability, air purifiers availability and or health impacts of smoke."

As the Principal Officer of Canberra Health Services, I am authorised to make a decision on access or amendment to government information in the possession or control of Canberra Health Services. As agreed, CHS is required to provide a decision on your access application by Friday 6 March 2020.

I have identified 185 documents holding the information within scope of your access application. These are outlined in the schedule of documents included at <u>Attachment A</u> to this decision letter.

Decisions

I have decided to:

- grant full access to 63 documents; and
- grant part access to 138 documents.

My access decisions are detailed further in the following statement of reasons and the documents released to you are provided as <u>Attachment B</u> to this letter.

In reaching my access decision, I have taken the following into account:

- The FOI Act;
- The contents of the documents that fall within the scope of your request;
- The views of relevant third parties; and
- The Human Rights Act 2004.

Full Access

I have decided to grant full access to 63 documents at reference 2, 4-10, 14, 20-25, 28-29, 32, 40, 42, 45-47, 49, 52, 54-56, 60, 72-74, 84, 88-89, 92, 97, 99-105, 112, 131, 143-144, 146, 148, 152, 162-163, 166, 176, 178-180 and 183.

Partial Access

I have decided to grant partial access to 138 documents at reference 1, 3, 11-13, 15-19, 26-27, 30-31, 33-39, 41, 43-44, 48, 50-51, 53, 57-59, 61-71, 75-83, 85-87, 90-91, 93-96, 98, 106-111, 113-130, 132-142, 145, 147, 149-151, 153-161, 164-165, 167-175, 177, 181-182 and 184-185.

Public Interest Factors Favouring Disclosure

The following factors were considered relevant in favour of the disclosure of the documents:

 Schedule 2.1 (a) (i) promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government's accountability.

Public Interest Factors Favouring Non-Disclosure

The following factors were considered relevant in favour of the non-disclosure of the documents:

Schedule 2.2 (a) (ii) prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or any other
right under the Human Rights Act 2004.

The information that has been redacted is related to staff mobile numbers, personal information of employees of non-government agencies and third parties. On balance, I determined the information identified is contrary to the public interest and I have decided not to disclose this information. Additionally, documents at reference 82, 110, 125, 134, 139, 140, 142, 150, 159, 167 and 177 include out of scope information.

Charges

Processing charges to this request have been waived in accordance with section 107 (1).

The scope of your access application, my decision and documents released to you will be published in the disclosure log not less than three days but not more than 10 days after the date of this decision. With smoke lingering across the ACT this morning, air quality is being impacted.

With current levels, most people will not experience any health impact. However, people who are more sensitive to smoke in the air, particularly those with asthma and other heart or lung conditions, should be aware and take precautions. This includes taking medication as prescribed by their doctor, limiting time spent outdoors and avoiding vigorous exercise.

Anyone with concerns about their health should seek medical advice from their health practitioner, and anyone experiencing wheezing, chest tightness or difficulty breathing should seek urgent medical assistance. In the event of a medical emergency call triple zero (000).

People can monitor air quality levels across the ACT by downloading the AirRater app (https://airrater.org/)

The Health Directorate will also continue to monitor levels. Further public health advice will be issued if needed.



Air quality update: Health advice

The health advice for today remains the same as the advice provided over the weekend regarding the smoke haze across Canberra. Please refer to ACT Health's fact sheet on the health impacts of outdoor smoke, <u>fact sheet</u>. ACT Health is monitoring the air quality and will advise the public if there are any changes to this advice when needed.

For now, due to the poor air quality, all Canberrans should avoid prolonged or heavy physical activity outside when there is smoke around.

Anyone who is sensitive to the effects of smoke and air pollution should take measures to reduce their exposure. This includes people with chronic heart or lung conditions, children 14 years or younger, pregnant women and people over 65 years should avoid all physical activity outside.

Anyone with a heart or lung condition should take their medication as prescribed by their doctor. People with asthma should follow their asthma action plan. Anyone with concerns about their health should seek medical advice from their doctor. Anyone experiencing wheezing, chest tightness or difficulty breathing should seek urgent medical attention and in the event of a medical emergency call triple-zero (000).

People can take the following precautions to help minimise the effects of smoke and air pollution:

- Stay indoors, with windows and doors closed;
- Stay in air-conditioned premises and switch the air-conditioner to 'recycle' or 'recirculate' to reduce the amount of smoke entering the building;
- Visit a local air-conditioned building such as a library, community centre or shopping centre; and
- Check on elderly neighbours or other people who you think might need extra help.

ACT Health will continue to monitor the air quality in the ACT and will advise the public of additional public health advice when needed and as information becomes available.

Canberra's air quality is continuing to deteriorate due to smoke. The most recent ACT Health Directorate advice is available on the ACT Health website.

In particular, we have noticed some smoke in the Bowes Street offices (with level 4 being more affected than levels 2 and level 3). It is likely that other ACT Government buildings, and people's homes will be affected to some extent.

The Bowes Street building management have closed, or reduced the outside air dampers and fans to their lowest capacity, since the smoke has started rolling through Canberra. This would be the case in most buildings. However, some smoke will still enter any building.

The health advice for people is that anyone:

- · with a heart or lung condition should take their medication as prescribed by their doctor,
- with asthma should follow their asthma action plan,
- with concerns about their health should seek medical advice from their doctor, and
- experiencing wheezing, chest tightness or difficulty breathing should seek medical attention.

If a staff member is experiencing significant discomfort, especially if they're in a high-risk group, they should talk to their manager about their options, including working on a different level or working from home if it is less likely to be affected.

ACT Health alert: Smoke and extreme heat impacting Canberra

The ACT Health Directorate are today upgrading health advice to the community due to the deterioration of air quality across Canberra from smoke.

ACT Public Health Physician, Dr Vanessa Johnston said the impact of the smoke haze on air quality is being intensified by the extreme heat conditions that are forecast to continue over the coming days.

"Our air quality is being significantly impacted by this combination of bushfire smoke, extremely high temperatures and lack of wind, which means the smoke is lingering," Dr Johnston said.

"During these periods of heavy smoke haze, all Canberrans are advised to avoid physical activity outside.

"People who are sensitive to smoke, especially those with pre-existing heart and lung conditions, should take extra care and stay indoors where possible and take medication prescribed by their doctor."

People who are sensitive to smoke and air pollution can also be more vulnerable to heat-related illness. This includes:

- people with heart or lung conditions (including asthma)
- · children aged less than 14 years
- pregnant women, and
- people over 65 years of age.

"With the extreme heat, it is also important for everyone to be aware and prepare for the hot temperatures," Dr Johnston said.

"During these times, it is vital for people to stay hydrated and to keep cool.

"People should make sure they are drinking plenty of cool water – don't wait until you are thirsty. People should also avoid being outdoors in the hottest parts of the day.

"We are strongly advising people more vulnerable to these conditions to take extra care while these heavy levels of smoke are lingering. This includes remaining indoors and keeping activity levels as low as possible.

"Anyone with a heart or lung condition should take their medication as prescribed by their doctor. People with asthma should follow their asthma action plan.

"Anyone with concerns about their health should seek medical advice from their doctor. And anyone experiencing wheezing, chest tightness or difficulty breathing should seek urgent medical attention and in the event of a medical emergency call triple-zero (000)."

Canberra Health Services Chief Operating Officer Elizabeth Chatham said the Emergency Department at Canberra Hospital had seen a small increase in respiratory-related presentations today.

"We would like to reinforce ACT Health's advice to avoid outside physical activity, stay indoors with windows and doors closed and use recycled air conditioning," Ms Chatham said.

"We can implement plans should we see a spike in presentations for asthma and respiratory related illnesses, however this is not necessary at this stage.

"If you have an appointment with any of our clinics today and feel well enough to come in, please attend your appointment as planned.

"However, if you are sensitive to smoke you should take measures to reduce your exposure. This includes staying indoors (with windows and doors closed) where possible. Canberra Health Services staff will work with you to reschedule your appointment if you're unable to attend due to the smoke."

The ACT Health Directorate is continuing to monitor the air quality in the ACT and will advise the public of additional public health advice when needed and as information becomes available.

At this time, the smoky air conditions are expected to continue to impact the ACT while the NSW bushfires are burning, with dense smoke impacting a large area of our region.

P2 Masks

P2 masks for staff are available through supply. P2 masks are rated to filter fine particles if fitted correctly. To order the area will need to supply a cost centre and go to the loading dock to pick them up. The contact number is x42979

They will be prioritised for areas such as Intensive Care, Neonatal Intensive Care, the Emergency Department, 14B, Paeds and for staff working outside e.g. home visits, etc if supplies become low.

Outdoor Smoke - Health Impacts

Smoke from fires, including building fires, woodfire heaters, bushfires and hazard reduction burns, is made up of small particles and may include carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide, nitrogen oxides and volatile organic compounds.

Smoke can be harmful to your health and especially harmful to people who already have breathing-related difficulties.

What are the health effects of inhaling smoke?

Common symptoms that you may experience when around smoke includes:

- · Itchy or burning eyes
- Throat irritation
- Runny nose
- Shortness of breath and coughing

Symptoms can occur for several days after exposure. Prolonged exposure to smoke particles can aggravate existing lung conditions, such as **chronic bronchitis**, **emphysema**, **asthma** and other **cardiac** conditions. If you have a heart or lung condition, follow your treatment plan prescribed by your doctor.

Who can be affected by inhaling smoke?

Anyone can experience symptoms from inhaling smoke. People who are especially sensitive to the effects of smoke include:

- · People with heart or lung conditions (including asthma)
- · Children aged less than 14 years
- · Pregnant women
- People over 65 years of age

How will I know if smoke concentrations are dangerous?

Usually smoke can be seen as a visible haze and can be detected by its distinctive smell. The more visible the smoke haze, and the stronger the odour, the more likely the smoke contains concentrations of gases and/or particles that are hazardous to your health.

INFORMATION



What health precautions can I take?

The following precautions can help you minimise health effects from exposure:

- · Leave the area for a cleaner environment
- · Stay indoors, with windows and doors closed
- Stay in air-conditioned premises and switch the air-conditioner to 'recycle' or 'recirculate' to reduce the amount of smoke entering the building
- Only use an evaporative cooler if the system is filtered.
 Note: some domestic evaporative coolers are less likely to filter fine particles such as smoke and may introduce smoke inside. If you have any questions about your evaporative cooler, please speak to the manufacturer or place of purchase as models may vary.
- Visit a local air-conditioned building such as a library, community centre or shopping centre
- Avoid vigorous exercise, especially if you have asthma or other chronic respiratory and/or chronic cardiac disease
- If you have asthma, continue taking your medication, follow your asthma plan, and consult with your general practitioner if required
- If it is safe to do so, check on elderly neighbours or other people who you think might need extra help

Anyone with concerns about their health should seek medical advice from their doctor. If you experience chest tightness, wheezing, or difficulty breathing, seek urgent medical assistance. In an emergency, call triple zero (000).

Can I wear a mask to protect me from smoke?

If you must be outdoors when smoke is present, consider wearing a P2 / N95 rated mask designed to filter fine particles. These masks are available from hardware retailers and other safety equipment suppliers. P2 / N95 masks sold in Australia are usually only available in adult sizes and will not fit most children aged less than 12 years.

To offer the best protection, a P2 / N95 mask must be fitted properly. When purchasing P2 / N95 masks it is important to take time to correctly identify which size and style of mask is suitable for you.

The following steps should be followed to ensure a P2/N95 mask is correctly fitted:

 Remove glasses and hats. Tie back long hair so it does not become tangled in the straps of the mask

- 2. Put the mask on your face, ensuring the nose piece is at the top of the mask
- 3. Place the top strap or tie high on the back of your head
- 4. Move the bottom strap over your head and position it below your ears
- 5. Compress the mask against the face to ensure a seal across the bridge of the nose
- 6. Compress the mask to ensure a seal across the cheeks and the face
- 7. Conduct a fit check: check the seal of the mask by gently inhaling. If the mask is not drawn in towards the face, or air leaks around the face seal, readjust the mask and repeat process or check for defects in the mask. If the mask still leaks you may need to try a different size or style of mask
- People with beards should shave before using a P2 / N95 mask as a good seal between the mask and the wearer's face cannot be guaranteed if they have facial hair.

Smoke in the air in Canberra has been a problem over the last few weeks, and this is likely to continue on and off over the coming weeks.

Facilities management have worked across CHS's buildings since the smoke has started rolling through Canberra to minimise smoke entry, and staff should assist this by keeping windows closed and not prop doors open. However, some smoke will still enter any building.

The health advice for people is that anyone:

- with a heart or lung condition should take their medication as prescribed by their doctor,
- · with asthma should follow their asthma action plan,
- · with concerns about their health should seek medical advice from their doctor, and
- · experiencing wheezing, chest tightness or difficulty breathing should seek medical attention.

If a staff member is experiencing significant discomfort, especially if they're in a high-risk group, they should talk to their manager about their options, including working in a different location or working from home if it is less likely to be affected.

For more health advice, refer to the Outdoor Smoke Health Impacts Factsheet.

P2 masks may be helpful for outdoor labourers, however these have not been recommended for indoor use. Ordinary surgical masks are not designed to prevent smoke inhalation, and are not recommended.

Smoke in the air in Canberra has been a problem over the last few weeks, and this is likely to continue on and off over the coming weeks.

Facilities management have worked across CHS's buildings since the smoke has started rolling through Canberra to minimise smoke entry, and staff should assist this by keeping windows closed and not prop doors open. However, some smoke will still enter any building.

The health advice for people is that anyone:

- · with a heart or lung condition should take their medication as prescribed by their doctor,
- · with asthma should follow their asthma action plan,
- · with concerns about their health should seek medical advice from their doctor, and
- experiencing wheezing, chest tightness or difficulty breathing should seek medical attention.

If a staff member is experiencing significant discomfort, especially if they're in a high-risk group, they should talk to their manager about their options, including working in a different location or working from home if it is less likely to be affected.

For more health advice, refer to the Outdoor Smoke Health Impacts Factsheet.

P2 masks may be helpful for outdoor labourers, however these have not been recommended for indoor use. Ordinary surgical masks are not designed to prevent smoke inhalation, and are not recommended.

Good afternoon

Re the correct wearing of masks:

Prior to donning of a face mask perform hand hygiene

- if wearing a surgical mask-colour of the mask faces outwards with the metallic strip upper most to be placed across
 your nose, ensure the earloops are secure over your ears. The mask is sealed by pressing carefully across the nose and
 expanding the pleats of the mask to ensure the mask fits correctly
- If wearing a P2/N95 mask orange in colour facing outwards ensure you separate the straps and place over your face
 and head. Press the mask firmly across your nose pressing the metallic strip to gain a firm fit then expand the mask to
 fit under your chin. With this mask it should be fit tested to have a snug fit and that there are no leaks. These masks
 have a 0.3 micron filtration.
- It is important that the wearer should avoid touching the front of the mask. If this were to occur the wearer should perform hand hygiene.
- Both masks are good until they become moist (the wearer should gauge this).
- If you go for a meal break dispose of the mask. Masks should not be kept in pockets or around your neck or hung for
 reuse but removed and disposed of into bins immediately. The wearer must then perform hand hygiene.

Surgical masks should be readily available on all wards.

P2/N95 are on wards where there is likely to be patients in negative pressure rooms or undertake flu testing and management. In addition areas that have neutropenic patient or who have had gastro outbreaks in the past may also have some supplies.

There is no need to contact IHSS about your air conditioning unless you notice a severe change in air quality.

P2 Masks

P2 masks for staff are available through supply. P2 masks are rated to filter fine particles if fitted correctly.

To order the area will need to supply a cost centre and go to the loading dock to pick them up. The contact number is x42979

They will be prioritised for areas such as Intensive Care, Neonatal Intensive Care, the Emergency Department, 14B, Paeds and for staff working outside e.g. home visits, etc if supplies become low.

Good afternoon JHS staff,

Due to the smoke and the current fire danger I want to pass on a few important messages so that we can be all be safe and prepared:

Saturday 4 January

Saturday 4 January is predicted to be a day of extreme fire danger. If you live in a high bushfire prone area, we want to support you to stay home and do what you need to keep your families safe. Please let your rostering manager know ASAP if you think you won't be able to attend work on the weekend.

Masks

We are ordering N95/P2 masks for all JHS staff.

Secure inpatient clients and Forensic Community MH clients will also be offered masks.

AMC - ACTCS are supplying detainees with masks. If a detainee requests a mask, please direct them to a custodial officer.

Bimberi - JHS to supply masks to young people who request them

It is very important that the masks are fitted correctly. Here is a video that is promoted by Commonwealth Department of Health in regards to fitting the mask. Please note that even though the mask in the video may look different the principles of fitting still apply https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=slkbyfJ5YRQ When fitted correctly, a N95/P2 respirator mask offers protection from diseases spread by droplet and airborne transmission. Please note: People with chronic respiratory, cardiac, or other medical conditions that make breathing difficult should check with their GP before using an N95/P2 respirator mask because the mask can make it more difficult for the wearer to breathe. The masks are single use to should be replaced daily and if they are soiled or become damaged or become wet.

Limiting Movement

Please discuss with your Team Manager or CNC about how we are limiting movements for your site. Generally however, we are looking at ways of reducing prolonged exposure to the outside.

AMC - Reducing medication rounds so that all medications can be given over 2 rounds instead of 3.

Forensic Community MH - we are limiting walking to and from the Courts. No home visits.

Bimberi – please visit young people in their accommodation where possible and if safe to do so. This will mean there will be less delays in young people being brought up to the centre.

Secure Inpatient – no outdoor activities.

Staff with Chronic Illness or who are pregnant

For any staff who have a chronic illness or cardiac or respiratory condition or who are pregnant and need a flexible arrangement, please discuss with your manager so that we can support you and roster effectively. If you think you may not be able to attend work, that is completely understandable and please let your rostering manager know as soon as possible so that we can fill the roster and make sure we appropriately staffed.

Road Safety

Please be careful when driving to and from work and if you are driving between work sites. There are many animals on the road due to smoke and looking for water and these can hazardous to drivers. If you are late for work please don't hurry, be safe.

Please everyone stay safe, keep communicating and keep supporting each other and those we are here to care for.

Quick Reference Guide (QRG) Daily Outdoor Air Quality Risk Assessment

Below is the proposed guidance framework to identify, mitigate and risk assess in conjunction with workers the hazard exposure associated with poor air quality and impacts inclusive of working in heat prior to commencing outdoor work activities.

Guidance note: Persons at potential risk due to poor air quality and working in heat include but are not limited to:

- People prone to respiratory conditions inclusive of eye and respiratory tract irritation to disorders such as breathing problems, bronchitis, increased severity of asthma
- · pre-existing cardiovascular conditions
- · pre-existing heart and lung problems
- · People over 65, children 14 years and younger, pregnant women

Risk Assessment Guideline:

- (a) Identify the outdoor air quality level (PM_{2.5} concentration) from the nearest air quality station (Monash,
 Florey or Civic) and compare with the relevant ACT Health advisory categories for smoky air
 https://www.health.act.qov.au/about-our-health-system/population-health/environmental-monitoring/monitoring-and-regulating-air-0
 - (b) Review the daily temperature forecast via BOM site http://www.bom.gov.au/act/forecasts/canberra.shtml

Once air quality level has been established, temperature, wind and weather conditions identified:

- Complete the attached Multiple Hazard Risk Assessment tool daily in conjunction with the workgroup, consideration to be given to the following components:
- Hazard identification
 - Type of outdoor work activity (essential/critical/non-essential etc.)
 - Nature of outdoor work activity (strenuous, low physical impact i.e. passive etc.)
 - Hazard/s associated with specific outdoor work activity (air quality, working in heat etc.)
- Dose-response assessment
 - Temperature forecast working in heat controls to capture heightened risk of heat stress/stroke
 - Air quality PM2.5 concentration to guide mitigation controls inclusive of levels of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) such as respiratory, eye etc.
 - Age (over 65) and health status of the outdoor work group (pre-existing health issues respiratory, heart, lung, asthmatic, cardiovascular disease, pregnancy etc.)
- Exposure assessment
 - time/duration of exposure (to be based on the above identified "type, nature, hazard/s" specific to the work activity)
- Risk estimation and characterisation

If the work is not essential then consider re-scheduling or postponing (i.e. eliminate the risk). If the work/activity is essential and must proceed, be specific and clarify identified controls required:

- Specific type and level of identified Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)
- Defined heat/air quality exposure duration/s (time in field), job rotation timeframes etc.
- Ongoing air quality monitoring plan for duration of work (i.e. monitor and check website hourly)
- Specific controls (where identified) for scheduled activity breaks for workers, availability of rest areas, access to cool fresh water, increased First Aid, Medical equipment or resources and/or arrangements in addition to existing Emergency Management Plans
- Protocols to cover further deterioration of conditions or introduction of new hazards (dust, fire, low visibility, increase in wind etc.) including monitoring methodology and supervision, review and communication with affected workers
- Worker self-management protocols (i.e. agreed processes for workers to cease work if uncomfortable or at onset of adverse symptoms)
- Factor in uncertainty
 - Alternative agreed work arrangements
 - Ensure work group give due consideration to any/all potential new hazards that can foreseeably be introduced from deteriorating or changing conditions impacted by heat and/or air quality.

ACT Health uses a system of seven health advisory categories for smoky air. The categories are based on the 24-hour rolling average concentrations of PM2.5 in the air. Each category has cautionary health advice that suggests practical ways to reduce exposure to smoke.

Yesterday the air quality in the building was not favourable and 1 staff member who suffers from asthma had to go home shortly after starting their shift following an asthma attack. All other staff were issued masks and were able to carry out their duties. The roller shutters in the building had many gaps which was allowing smoke to enter the building. Staff have used some linen to seal the gaps and this, along with more favourable outside conditions, has improved the internal air quality today.

We do have capacity for 7 beds over the weekend and we can offer a least restrictive option,, however, AMHRU is a subacute environment so all patients will need to have a risk assessment to ensure that they are more suitable for the AMHRU open ward as supposed to AMHU/Duhlwa. We also request that the patients remain under the care of Forensic staff.

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

Thank you to those of you who were able to attend this morning's briefing.

Unfortunately we had some technical difficulties with the start of the recording, so I would like to reiterate the following key points.

- My key message is to stay calm. There's a lot of anxiety about smoke both here and in the
 community, as well as concern about the weather conditions over the weekend. It is uncomfortable
 and it going to continue to be uncomfortable. It is uncomfortable right across Canberra. However
 we are an essential service and we need to continue providing our patients with care.
- We will continue to monitor air quality across Canberra Health Services buildings and manage any identified risks.
- I have and will continue to work with the Security and Emergency Management Senior Officials Group (SEMSOG) and Emergency Control Centre (ECC).
- We will be standing up the Hospital Emergency Operations Centre (HEOC) today and over the
 weekend to ensure that we are well prepared and able to respond as required.
- Our community workers will continue to provide support to our patients. I acknowledge that this
 may be difficult during this time, but we need to keep looking after our patients and providing
 exceptional health care.
- If your health is affected by the smoke, or if you have any other concerns, please speak with your manager. Alternatively, you can contact the Office of the Chief Operating Officer during business hours on extension 42728 or email chscoo@act.gov.au. If you have concerns after hours, please contact the after hours coordinator through switchboard 5124 0000.
- The medical advice about masks is that if you are healthy and not working outside, you do not need to wear a mask. However if you want to wear a mask in CHS and you feel it provides a measure of comfort, you can wear a mask. Please ensure you wear the masks correctly and follow correct infection control measures. Tips on correctly fitting masks are available on this fact sheet.

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

Just wanting to provide some additional information for Directors and those who have kindly made themselves available to support MHJHADS operations over the weekend if we need. As you are aware, we are heading into a tricky weekend with the ACT facing unprecedented smoke haze, extreme weather conditions and fire danger. A State of Alert has now been declared in the ACT.

The Security and Emergency Management Senior Officials Group (SEMSOG) met today to progress emergency management planning for the Territory and an Emergency Control Centre (ECC) has been established out at Fairbairn

A Hospital Emergency Operations Centre (HEOC) was also stood up and will continue over the weekend to ensure Canberra Health Services are well prepared and able to respond if required

Overall my sense is that our Division is reasonably well prepared in the event we are faced with a code brown situation

- While there will be no change to the Director on call arrangements to manage to usual activity, I will be the point of contact for our Division with regards the escalation of any additional information to and from the HEOC. Don't hesitate to contact me over the weekend if you or any of our teams need issues escalated. I will continue to circulate any information of importance as it becomes available to keep you all in the loop
- Exposure to smoke for our teams working in the community remains a concern. Teams should triage work accordingly and also support those colleagues who may be struggling with the conditions. If staff feel unwell or the smoke is impacting their health and ability to work they should be relieved from duty until they are fit for work.
- Air quality within the buildings is not great. Essentially there is not much that can be done. Some teams have already made arrangements for work arounds, with some teams temporarily relocating
- Please be alert that AMC, Dhulwa and ECU are quite exposed in the event of bushfires however the staff are well prepared and contingencies are in place. Dannielle has kindly offered to remain the contact person should AMC be impacted or need additional work arounds etc.
- Most teams have a list of additional staff who may be available to work if needed over the weekend.
- BCP's were circulated earlier today. It may pay to have a paper copy handy just in case.

Twice daily briefings will be continuing in the hospital auditorium over the weekend at 9,30am, and 4pm for any senior clinical staff who would like to attend. These will be followed up by all staff emails to keep everyone in the loop.

I really appreciate those who have made themselves available to provide additional assistance if needed. I'm hopeful we won't need to call you and you can enjoy your weekends!

Thank you for those of you who were able to attend this afternoon's all staff briefing.

A State of Alert was declared for the ACT this afternoon and ACT ESA Commissioner Georgina Whelan has been appointed as the Emergency Controller. The ACT Government initiated the increased emergency response in light of forecast severe fire danger, particularly on Saturday 4 January 2020.

A summary of this alert is as follows:

- A State of Alert is a signal to the community that we must all be prepared for extreme conditions.
- Many Canberrans are anxious about smoke and the risk to properties from potential bushfires. This measure
 will allow the ESA to further prepare in the case of an emergency.
- For people travelling from the South Coast and needing a break, the ACT Government has set up a Relief Centre at Dickson College to provide assistance and support. The Government is also looking to establish driver reviver spots along the Monaro Highway.

Subject: Considerations with P2 masks

Dear both

On the back of the acceptance by the ACT government of 100,000 P2/N95 (I'm not sure which type) from the national pandemic stockpile, we need to consider our advice on who should get these and how they are distributed. Questions I was asked by Kathy and Minister SS this afternoon include how we define vulnerable and how long the masks would last for under different scenarios...

There will be an AHPPC teleconference in the morning to further discuss some issues, including the P2 factsheet and whether we can provide any consistent words around who should be prioritised.

All ACT advice should be prefaced with the point that removing from the environment is the best option - that is, indoors with doors and windows closed. Masks are not a replacement for this.

Important considerations are, given this may go for another 1-2 months:

- · Primary consideration whether we need to reserve some of these for ESA use
- clinical risks associated with providing to some of the sensitive groups, and whether we can appropriately
 mitigate this. Provision of masks comes with a duty of care. They are not appropriate for children, and I'm
 not sure if there are risks for pregnant women/elderly and whether they would need assessment... how on
 earth would we manage access/distribution.
- Whether exposure to hazardous air quality by Canberrans has enough periods of intermittent relief, and are there enough opportunities for Canberrans to seek protection from the outdoors (?groups of Canberrans such as homeless who cannot). Outdoor workers would be the other potential consideration here...
- Need for protection for people returning to burnt properties risks of asbestos and other particulate matter from destroyed houses (recovery response).

I have discussed with Karen Doran trying to gain some time for appropriate consideration of this - on Monday we would have better access to technical input...

More detail on my current thinking below, but thanks for reading, Kerryn

- sensitive individuals who are more at risk of acute exacerbation this includes those with chronic
 respiratory and/or lung conditions my concern and caution here is about adverse outcomes for these atrisk individuals if there is not appropriate medical consideration and training re who is safe to use them and
 who. The national fact sheet is quite strong of the risks for these groups. This would need medical input and
 consideration of appropriate mechanisms of distribution... i will ask what other CHOs are considering in the
 space tomorrow but suspect the next category is bigger on their list.
- Exposure to hazardous levels which is unavoidable and persists for days without respite this is where i
 believe Victoria is focusing in areas of significant current activity and no limited opportunities to shelter
 indoors. I am trying to do some work around our pattern of hazardous levels compared to vic and nsw
 areas/cities... and that the periods of relief can be demonstrated with the data. The outcome is likely to be
 that environmental circumstances at this time do not justify general community access. (Difficult to sell so
 far)

Returning home after properties/areas have been burnt - both due to residual smoke and toxic particles, as
well as asbestos issues. We should keep enough in reserve that if fire does impact properties we can
provide adequately to home owners returning.

NB: The Commonwealth Crisis Centre had reported in its 6:30 update to emergency service organisations that the ACT had 1 bushfire at the Advice level. They have been contacted to correct the record.

1. COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Access Canberra Contact Centre is being relocated to Woden due to smoke in TransACT house. No expected loss of service. Minimal smoke-related calls received overnight.

1.1 Relief Centres for people transiting through Canberra (location & opening hours)

Dickson College remains open. 8 people attended overnight, 98 people have accessed the service since it was established. For the first time ACT residents attended the centre for smoke relief. The Centre will remain open for as long as it is needed, to be reviewed Sunday afternoon.

1.2 Evacuation Centres (opened or prepared)

CSD has signage at both Lake Ginninderra College and Erindale College referring members of the public to Dickson College.

Preparations are in place to activate those 2 centres, and the remaining 3 evacuation centres, if required.

1.3 Animal Management (locations and opening hours for temporary refuge centres)

There is sufficient capacity at the moment. Hall Showgrounds remain open for self-sufficient animal and owners on a 24/7 basis until Monday lunchtime. Queanbeyan Showgrounds are also open on a 24/7 basis, supported by NSW. Events ACT have confirmed that EPIC is available from 6pm Sunday if required [not for public advice at this stage], and Thoroughbred Park is available as a backup if required.

2. HEALTH

2.1 Air Quality status

ACT Health data is showing the air quality status for smoky air is at the Hazardous Extreme level across Canberra.

Easterly winds forecast to remain for the next 2 days will see smoky conditions continue.

2.2 Health issues (increased presentations)

There are currently 4 patients being treated for respiratory-related issues at the Canberra Hospital (CH). No current figures for Calvary. Total respiratory-related TCH presentations since 31/12 is 77. Smoke is impacting the Emergency Department but functions have not been affected. HEOC set up but not stood up.

3. CITY SERVICES IMPACTED

3.1 Transport

Light Rail operations have returned to normal following the earlier heat-related issues.

No known issues and services are continuing as normal. ACTION management have advised that bus drivers are expressing concern about driving in the smoky conditions without P2 masks.

Canberra Airport Operations are continuing as planned, but Qatar Airlines has cancelled its Canberra service today.

3.2 Electricity

No known issues. No instances of load shedding were reported in the ACT yesterday.

3.3 Water & Sewerage

No known issues

3.4 Public Spaces

All ACT Pools are closed.

National Arboretum is closed.

Civic Merry-go-round is closed.

All EPSDD-managed Nature Reserves and Public Places are closed.

All NCA open spaces are open to the public.

Lanyon Homestead, Calthorpes' House and Mugga Mugga are closed.

3.5 Roads Management (road repairs, traffic management, closures)

ACTP is reporting no traffic issues, with the exception of Summernats-related traffic around EPIC. They are undertaking public messaging about safe driving in the smoky-conditions.

There are no major roads in the surrounding region known to be closed, including the Monaro Highway to Cooma.

Hi Liz,

I have gone through the literature and the repots from 2 large studies from the USA, one referring to the large wildfire in California in 2003 and the other to wildfires in Colorado from 2007 – 2015 have reported that exposure to the small particle matter smoke from wildfires (PM_{2.5}) during the entire pregnancy was associated with preterm birth and low birth weight babies. The increased risks, while statistically significant, are small.

The study from the Canberra fires in 2003 showed an increased birthweight in male babies and no change in birthweights of female babies. This is thought to be due to an increased maternal stress response.

I think the advice we should be giving to pregnant women should remain the same i.e. to stay indoors if possible and to avoid going outdoors unless it is necessary and the same advice for masks.

I am happy to talk to media if necessary. I will be in theatre for a good part of tomorrow morning and hopefully free in the afternoon.



I have written this on my phone so a bit rough and needs re-arranging

To reduce the impacts of staff exposure to smoke medication rounds have been changed from 3 rounds per day to 2 rounds.

ALL detainees are still receiving all their prescribed medications.

The round which has been dropped is the midday round which is used for prin over the counter medications eg. Paracetamol, ibruprofen, hay fever relief

These prn medications are offered at the morning and evening rounds.

There have been no direct detainee complaints or through the statutory agencies (OV, HSC) of any detainee concern regarding this.

Most detainees with regular medication have these in their cells in Webster packs.

Detainees who require things like prn simple analgesic are given packs of 20 so that they can self administer just like in the community

Any detainee that has a prescribed midday medication that requires nursing supervision, is still receiving their medication at the prescribed time

If a detainee requires health assistance they are able to advise a custodial officer who will contact JHS. this has occurred without issue

- Directorates must follow their internal WHS procedures for the management of staff who
 may be exposed to poor air quality.
 - Levels of prolonged or heavy physical activity outdoors should be avoided so far as possible. Where this is not possible for operational reasons, shifts should be rotated regularly.
 - Staff who are sensitive to smoke, especially those with pre-existing heart and lung conditions, should take extra care by staying indoors and taking medication as prescribed by their doctor.
 - Evidence shows P2 masks do filter some smoke and are most commonly used in occupational settings where exposure to airborne particles occurs on a regular basis.
 - Where staff elect to use a mask, it is important to ensure the mask is fitted properly for it to be effective. For further information on how to fit P2 masks visit the Health website (www.health.act.gov.au).
- The Emergency Services Agency (ESA) Resource Centre (Amberley Avenue Fairbairn) is now maintaining stocks of P2 masks that are available for issue to Directorates on the following conditions:
 - Directorates should initially draw down on their own stocks of P2 masks before seeking additional masks from ESA, including the use of existing procurement contracts.
 - Once exhausted, Directorates should source P2 masks from ESA who are coordinating a whole of government approach to the supply of masks.
 - Directors-General must nominate one or more executives to coordinate and approve an order for P2 masks to ESA.
 - Orders for P2 masks from directorates must be consistent with the expected daily consumption rate. It is recommended that directorates place orders that will sustain 2-3 days of mask requirements.

- Justice Health Services (JHS) staff and detainees at the Alexander Maconochie Centre (AMC) have been
 impacted by poor air quality and the excessive smoke currently surrounding Canberra
- Al staff and detainees at AMC continue to take precautionary measures. This includes the offer of P2
 masks. JHS staff are providing advice to detainees to ensue these masks are fitted and replaced
 appropriately and their use is consistent with advice provided by the ACT Chief Medical Officer
- There are no immediate concerns for the health of detainees at AMC related to the current conditions, which
 exceed those posed to the general Canberra community
- JHS staff have triaged detainees and identified those who may be vulnerable, require increased medical monitoring or proactive clinical intervention
- If a detainee requires health assistance they are able to advise a custodial officer who will contact JHS. This
 has occurred without issue
- JHS continue to proactively review detainees at each medication round to ensure any concerns can be addressed promptly
- To reduce the impacts of staff exposure to smoke, medication rounds have been temporarily reduced from 3 to 2 rounds per day
 - The round which has been dropped is the midday round which is used for prn over the counter medications eg. Paracetamol, ibruprofen, hay fever relief. These prn medications are offered at the morning and evening rounds.
 - ALL detainees are still receiving all their prescribed medications and any detainee that has a
 prescribed midday medication that requires nursing supervision, they will continue to receive their
 medication at the prescribed time
 - o Most detainees with regular medication have these in their cells in Webster packs.
 - Detainees who require simple analgesic for PRN use are given packs of 20 so that they can selfadminister as they would in the community
 - There have been no concerns raised by detainees regarding this temporary change

I have been asked to pull together some urgent dot points for the Minister for MH with regards the welfare of detainees at AMC given the current impact of the smoke and also to provide advice re: our decision o reduce medication rounds from 3 to 2 times daily. This will probably also go the Min for Health

Dannielle (thank you) and I have pulled together the following, but as the identified S21 Doctor I just need to clear these with you (Bernadette specifically requested your input). If you could give me a quick call or reply to this email when you get chance that would be fab.

- Justice Health Services (JHS) staff and detainees at the Alexander Maconochie Centre (AMC) have been impacted by poor air quality and the excessive smoke currently surrounding Canberra
- Al staff and detainees at AMC continue to take precautionary measures. This includes the offer of P2 masks. JHS staff are providing advice to detainees to ensue these masks are fitted and replaced appropriately and their use is consistent with advice provided by the ACT Chief Medical Officer
- There are no immediate concerns for the health of detainees at AMC related to the current conditions, which exceed those posed to the general Canberra community
- JHS staff have triaged detainees and identified those who may be vulnerable, require increased medical monitoring or proactive clinical intervention
- If a detainee requires health assistance they are able to advise a custodial officer who will contact JHS. This has occurred without issue

- IHS continue to proactively review detainees at each medication round to ensure any concerns can be addressed promptly
- To reduce the impacts of staff exposure to smoke, medication rounds have been temporarily reduced from 3 to 2 rounds per day
- The round which has been dropped is the midday round which is used for prn over the counter medications eg. Paracetamol, ibruprofen, hay fever relief. These prn medications are offered at the morning and evening rounds.



Purpose

To provide you with an update on activities undertaken by Canberra Health Services (CHS) on Sunday 5 January in response to hazardous smoke across the Territory and the Territory-wide State of Alert – 5:30pm update.

CHS Current Status

- A briefing has been undertaken for Canberra Health Services staff at 4:00pm.
- Key messages were about the hazardous smoke across the Territory and strategies we are using to manage the impact on staff and patients.
- A video has been developed with the Director of Respiratory and Sleep Medicine, Dr Stuart Schembri which provides advice to staff on dealing with this smoke event. The video was shown at the briefing this afternoon and will also be sent to all staff.
- The Hospital Emergency Operations Centre (HEOC) was stood down at 5:30pm and will be stood up again at 8:30am tomorrow morning. This will allow us to continue to manage the impact of smoke on our staff and patients.
- CHS continues to encourage staff to take more regular breaks with the support of their supervisor and if they are feeling unwell from the smoke, to take personal leave.
- Two MRI machines continue to be out of operation due to the smoke and we are working to get them back up and running as soon as possible.
- Justice Health Services (JHS) staff and detainees at the Alexander Maconochie Centre (AMC) have been impacted by poor air quality and the excessive smoke in the ACT.
- All staff and detainees at AMC continue to take precautionary measures and have been offered P2 masks. JHS staff are providing advice to detainees to ensure these masks are fitted properly and replaced appropriately and their use is consistent with advice provided by the ACT Chief Health Officer.
- There are no immediate concerns for the health of detainees at AMC related to the current conditions.
- JHS staff have triaged detainees and identified those who may be vulnerable, require increased medical monitoring or proactive clinical intervention.

- If a detainee requires health assistance, they have been advised to alert a custodial officer who will contact JHS.
- JHS continue to proactively review detainees at each medication round to ensure any concerns can be addressed promptly.
- To reduce the impacts of staff exposure to smoke, medication rounds have been temporarily reduced from 3 to 2 rounds per day. There have been no concerns raised by detainees regarding this temporary change.
- The next daily briefing will be held at 9:30am tomorrow morning (Monday, 6 January 2020).

 to your manager in the first instance.





I would first like to acknowledge and extend my sympathies to colleagues and their families who have experienced loss or hardship over the weekend. Our thoughts are with you and your families at this time. As always, all staff, but especially those who need extra support, are encouraged to use the services available through the Employee Assistance Program (EAP).

Thank you to the many ACT Public Service staff as well as large number of volunteers who have worked over the weekend to keep our community safe and informed. I am so proud of our efforts, including those in our emergency services and others who have worked tirelessly to assist on the front line, in our respite/recovery centre or in the coordination of our many resources. Their work continues to ensure that we are well prepared if there is an emergency here in Canberra.

This is also a time where staff may have competing commitments and responsibilities and may need to access flexible work arrangements or leave which is available and outlined in the various Enterprise Agreements. In addition to personal and annual leave, staff may also be entitled to personal leave in extraordinary and unforeseen circumstance, compassionate leave and Community Service Leave (F13) that includes Voluntary emergency management.

Following the Prime Minister's call up of reservists I would like to remind emergency services personnel including hospital personnel, Rural Fire Services (RFS) and State Emergency Services (SES) volunteers that they are exempt from this call up and can continue to perform their critical functions. For those reservists who are being mobilised you can access leave (with or without pay) to fulfil your reservist duties.

While we are experiencing milder weather conditions, more extreme weather conditions are forecast for the ACT and our surrounding region in the coming days. The State of Alert will continue so that we can ensure our emergency services are able to be as responsive as possible to any risks of bushfire.

Our Corporate teams remain in regular contact with ACT Property Group and building managers to ensure areas of concern, where identified, are addressed as effectively as possible. If you or your colleagues are struggling with air quality please talk to your supervisor and seek treatment if required. A Quick Reference Guide has been developed to assist with risk assessment of outdoor work activities and has been circulated to directorates. All staff working outdoors should discuss with their supervisor the necessary precautions for these conditions including the need to return to an indoor location. For those of you working indoors please speak to your supervisors about how you can manage your health under these conditions. Alternate arrangements for staff with respiratory concerns or other health related issues such as relocation to another work area, flexible working arrangements etc. are some options that employees can discuss with their manager/supervisor. Your directorate's Corporate and Human Resources team are also available for support.

I have checked in with John Robson from Robson Environmental and provide the following answers to your questions;

- 1. What instrument is being used?
- a. The instrument being used is a Dusttrak DRX 8534 which test for PM1, 2.5 & 10 along with a 4 gas monitor to test for Carbon Monoxide, Nitrogen Dioxide and Oxygen.
- 2. How long are samples taken for?
- Robson have found that they are getting stable readings after 5 minutes so are recording these readings.
- 3. What are we comparing results to?
- a. The results being provided are a comparison between indoor and outdoor samples and also against AS 1668.2 and Commonwealth Guidelines. There is also a non-mandatory handbook for indoor air quality produced by the Australian Building Codes Board which can be found here: ABCB Handbook for indoor air quality but is not checked against.
- 4. What do we get back from the time span in relation to results?
- a. There will be a report provided showing the variance between outdoor and indoor samples and the levels of each particulate level and gas tested (PM1, 2.5, 10, CO, NO2, O2)

How are you doing?

There are several interesting studies on PTSD and burnout in firefighters. I am not aware of any systematic review as the one we conducted on flooding in 2015. I participated in a Movember Foundation study aimed at improving MH in men at work led by Uni Sydney and UNSW (Men@Work). This project included a study on MH in firemen but I did not participate in this sub-study.

I think that the study of burnout in firefighters conducted by Kim in South Korea is particularly valuable.

One of the most comprehensive studies on the impact of wildfires in several population groups was carried out in Canada in 2016 (Fort McMurray wildfire).

I hope that these papers might be useful

To understand how to better prepare and support people mentally, and from the public health perspective, for the next time has applications for Australia and beyond. So I agree with Matthew –research opportunities in the mental health (and public health space) are rich and I believe the community would be keen to engaged in them.

Something I asked myself is how many of volunteer fire fighters will get post-traumatic stress issues versus the regular fire service employees –mental exhaustion must take its toll – can we survey these members of our community and so we learn who better to prepare these stellar members of our community for the next time.

From my involvement today at Canberra Hospital today — the community (including our staff) have questions which do not seem to be answered with current online resources.

Moderate numbers of people are ringing the switch board just asking what should they do about their sore eyes, itchy throat etc – the public health space is wide open to develop useful evaluated tools here – today on our respiratory physicians did a simple Q and A video (answering questions like: are masks helpful with all this smoke, who should you use masks, air conditioners – use of recycled not outside air if possible). This video will be pushed out to the community tomorrow - seems very sensible – but such approaches need evaluation to know if they are effective (otherwise governments could waste lots of money on such programs). Others in the community are anxious, frightened and even angry we are not doing enough about the air quality in the hospital. We really need to developing consistent messaging- as we have seen with many successful past and present public health campaigns- the university sector could really assist here with good study design and evaluation

The government directs you to seek support eg:

- but what evidence is there the community finds it valuable can we collect the data on who used the services, what did they value, what could we do better and who does the community trust for advice (GP, walk in clinics, hospital, family member, internet).
- Already many in the community are "self-medicating" in terms of managing their respiratory symptoms so
 getting test and control groups for long term lung damage in other than the most severely affected people
 may be tricky.

Proper evaluation of such issues will be far more cost effective for the government in the long term so it is pleasing to read they are interested in having the conversation. So while this pathologist cannot assist directly with the research I am sure friends within CHM (eg ANU Medical School, RSPH and RSP) and other colleges with ANU could- perhaps repurpose evaluation and/or online tools they have already developed for other areas of health and wellbeing to conduct such evaluations.

Of course, CCG would assist with any plan if there is a consensus that an immunology or genomics approach would be worthwhile. My additional thoughts are:

- 1. From observations of the devastation, projects addressing mental health might be higher priorities
- 2. If we were to propose an immunology/ respiratory project, I think David has covered the possibilities. In terms of case ascertainment we could consider:
- a. Longitudinal study of long term lung damage (although I expect this will be very difficult to achieve)
- Cross-sectional study of acute lung injuries from smoke inhalation (ie those requiring hospital admission for respiratory support), in which case we could attempt to resolve differences in host responses compared with those in individuals without significant lung injury.
- Longitudinal study investigation of the incidence of asthma in those exposed to fires, with aims of resolving asthma phenotypes and their associated host factors.

In each case, the yield from sequencing is probably going to be small, but might be improved by careful case ascertainment and immune phenotyping. Anyway, happy to explore this further in the next 24-48hs.

Hello but have done a bit of thinking about relevant areas in my Dept/JCSMR. We do not have expertise in respiratory illness that I know of, so the best I can come up with are:

- 1) If there were an interested and capable respiratory physician at TCH, they could team up with Canberra Clinical Genomics in a study of to find genotypes that are predisposed to greater damage due to bushfire smoke inhalation.
- 2) Smoke elicits an inflammatory response and there may be an opportunity for Si Ming to investigate the mechanisms of this inflammation with his large panel of knockout and other mutant mice. Antje Blumenthal might be able to bring in a respiratory challenge model from her TB work (as an in vivo model, though there are others with more direct capabilities in this area elsewhere in Australia (e.g. Newcastle).

I've cc'd in the relevant people (Matt, Carola and Ed; Si Ming), so they can respond as to whether I'm way off beam here or there is some potential (I'm not really available until Tuesday 14th). I just wanted to be as creative with my thinking about this as possible!

As you may know our city is emerged in smoke and is unlikely to get better soon—as a PC2 lab I understand we need to have 80% of our air from outside and 20% recycled. The issue is the outside air is toxic and causing machines to fail due to particulate matter and our staff to have respiratory symptoms. I spoke to facilities management and we are considering moving to 60% "fresh" air and 40% in hematology/ biochem but continuing with 80% in other areas (eg microbiology) as an option to make the lab function better and help our staff feel more comfortable.

My questions

- 1. Is a lower % of outside air allowed under such circumstances?
- If allowed for how long I was thinking 4 or 8 h /day just to give us time to reduce the amount of smoke in the building.

I would appreciate a reply ASAP as my staff are struggling – I (or Kerrie or Tracey) will also try to ring in the morning. Thank you

I would first like to acknowledge and extend my sympathies to colleagues and their families who have experienced loss or hardship in recent days. Our thoughts are with you and your families at this time. As always, all staff, but especially those who need extra support, are encouraged to use the services available through the Employee Assistance Program (EAP).

Thank you to the many ACT Public Service staff as well as large number of volunteers who have worked over the weekend to keep our community safe and informed. I am so proud of our efforts, including those in our emergency services and others who have worked tirelessly to assist on the front line, in our respite/recovery centre or in the coordination of our many resources. Their work continues to ensure that we are well prepared if there is an emergency here in Canberra.

This is also a time where staff may have competing commitments and responsibilities and may need to access flexible work arrangements or leave which is available and outlined in the various Enterprise
Agreements. In addition to personal and annual leave, staff may also be entitled to personal leave in extraordinary and unforeseen circumstance, compassionate leave and community service leave that includes voluntary emergency management.

Following the Prime Minister's call-up of reservists I would like to remind emergency services personnel including hospital personnel, Rural Fire Services (RFS) and State Emergency Services (SES) volunteers that they are exempt from this call up and can continue to perform their critical functions. For those reservists who are being mobilised you can access leave (with or without pay) to fulfil your reservist duties.

While we are experiencing milder weather conditions, more extreme weather conditions are forecast for the ACT and our surrounding region in the coming days. The State of Alert will continue so that we can ensure our emergency services are able to be as responsive as possible to any risks of bushfire. Poor air-quality due to smoke will continue in Canberra. The latest information about managing your health in these conditions, provided by the ACT Health Directorate is available at https://www.health.act.gov.au/public-health-alert/air-quality-deterioration-across-act-smoke. Our Corporate teams remain in regular contact with ACT Property Group and building managers to ensure areas of concern, where identified, are addressed as effectively as possible. If you or your colleagues are struggling with air quality, please talk to your supervisor and seek treatment if required. A Quick Reference Guide has been developed to assist with risk assessment of outdoor work activities and has been circulated to directorates. All staff working outdoors should discuss with their supervisor the necessary precautions for these conditions including the need to return to an indoor location. For those of you working indoors please speak to your supervisors about how you can manage your health under these conditions. Alternate arrangements for staff with respiratory concerns or other health related issues such as relocation to another work area, flexible working arrangements etc. are some options that employees can discuss with their manager/supervisor. Your directorate's Corporate and Human Resources team are also available for support.

Firstly, I would like to say a big thank you to everyone for the work you have done over the past couple of days. I would also like to acknowledge your ongoing support and patience while we are experiencing these unprecedented weather conditions and the impact of bushfires.

The video recording of this morning's all staff briefing is below, however I'd like to draw your attention to a few key points.

Masks

We are receiving a lot of queries about the supply of masks to the community. Canberra Health Services does not have a supply of masks and is not distributing masks to the public. Our advice to the community is to remain indoors where possible, with windows and doors closed, and see the advice on the ESA and ACT Health Directorate websites.

If you have any concerns about masks, please review the <u>short video</u> below featuring the Director of Respiratory at Canberra Hospital, Stuart Schembri, sharing his smoke health advice. If you still require a mask, please speak with your manager.

Movement around Canberra Health Services sites

We ask all staff to minimise movement around CHS sites. Where possible we have closed external doors and windows and ask for your assistance in keeping smoke out of our buildings. This includes taking internal routes to your destination rather than external shortcuts which may introduce additional smoke to the buildings.

Fans, humidifiers and similar appliances


For safety reasons please do not bring in fans, humidifiers or similar appliances from home.

- Justice Health Services (JHS) staff and detainees at the Alexander Maconochie Centre (AMC) have been impacted by poor air quality and the excessive smoke currently surrounding Canberra
- Al staff and detainees at AMC continue to take precautionary measures. This includes the offer of P2 masks. JHS staff are providing advice to detainees to ensue these masks are fitted and replaced appropriately and their use is consistent with advice provided by the ACT Chief Medical Officer
- There are no immediate concerns for the health of detainees at AMC related to the current conditions, which exceed those posed to the general Canberra community
- JHS staff have triaged detainees and identified those who may be vulnerable, require increased medical monitoring or proactive clinical intervention
- If a detainee requires health assistance they are able to advise a custodial officer who will contact JHS. This has occurred without issue
- JHS continue to proactively review detainees at each medication round to ensure any concerns can be addressed promptly
- To reduce the impacts of staff exposure to smoke, medication rounds have been temporarily reduced from 3 to 2 rounds per day
 - The round which has been dropped is the midday round which is used for prn over the counter medications eg. Paracetamol, ibruprofen, hay fever relief. These prn medications are offered at the morning and evening rounds.
 - ALL detainees are still receiving all their prescribed medications and any detainee that has a
 prescribed midday medication that requires nursing supervision, they will continue to
 receive their medication at the prescribed time
 - Most detainees with regular medication have these in their cells in Webster packs.
 - Detainees who require simple analgesic for PRN use are given packs of 20 so that they can self-administer as they would in the community
 - There have been no concerns raised by detainees regarding this temporary change





Afternoon,

As requested, some information about likely air quality over the next few days.

Air quality is likely to remain poor for the remainder of Monday. Light NE winds overnight followed by NW winds during the day should clear some smoke on Tuesday, however some smoke haze is likely to remain. Areas of smoke haze are likely to remain in the ACT into Wednesday as light easterlies are forecast for Tuesday night, leading into Wednesday. Some westerlies may start to clear more smoke in the early afternoon of Wednesday, however the respite will be short lived as strong easterlies will impact the ACT from approximately 1700, which is very likely to bring smoke back in from the fires burning along the coast, reducing air quality. Easterlies are forecast for Thursday, and air quality may remain poor across the region.


The biggest respite we are likely to see with regard to air quality will be Friday. Strong (hot and dry) NW winds will push the smoke to the SE and result in better quality air for the time being.


Images attached are two snapshots from the BOM's experimental air quality website for today at 1500 and tomorrow at 0800. The air quality measurement image includes the scale for air quality.

Dear Linda,

I want to start by thanking those of you that are working hard to keep Canberra safe. Many ACT Public Servants have been working around the clock, 24/7 to protect the ACT. Whether as RFS, ESA or SES volunteers or as paid employees; the work you are doing is vital. Thank you.

A number of members have called our Member Service Centre asking about safety during the fires, air quality, or industrial entitlements available though your Enterprise Agreements. Below is the critical information you will need to know.

Essential Staff

There are a number of jobs undertaken by ACT Government staff that community safety depends on.

While this usually includes Fire, Ambulance and Police, it also involves other staff that keep our community safe and preserve life. This includes (but is not limited to) Corrective Services, acute hospital services staff, ESA staff and Public Transport. This list is by no means exhaustive.

It is important that during a declared State of Alert, that these services continue without interruption. Because of the critical nature of the work you do, it is important that **you remain at work**.

Of course, this doesn't mean you will be unaffected by the fires. If you need to leave your post (e.g. there is a direct threat to property, or risk to your family), please immediately discuss this with your manager.

Leave will be provided. CPSU has worked extensively with ACT Whole-of-Government to ensure that alternative arrangements are made. If issues arise with your release, please contact CPSU Lead Organiser

or the Member Service Centre on 1300 137 636.

Non-Essential Staff

For those of you that do not perform an essential service, leave to deal with emergencies should be much more straight forward. Leave is available through a Personal Leave application through HR21. If the leave is more than three days, some evidence may be required, but given the nature of the emergency, a Statutory Declaration will suffice.

Outside work v Inside work

If your workplace is primarily outside (and isn't an essential service) you should not be working outside.

Please talk to you workplace delegate, HSR and/or manager about working inside. Again, CPSU has worked extensively with the ACT Whole-of-Government, so if there are any issues, please call CPSU Lead Organiser

or our Member Service Centre on 1300 137 636.

Air quality in buildings

ACT Government has agreed that where air quality degrades inside an ACT Government workplace, staff can relocate to another office. Should the air quality in your building become problematic, please contact the CPSU immediately.

Hi Rhonda and Todd, Just a heads up...

It is my first day back at work today.

I have received feedback from the Link team (24 hour staffing) that the smoke load was very intense at times over the past few days.

They note that today the conditions are improved, but did raise the issue of lingering smell and smoke entry via the incomplete sealing of the windows due to the age of the building.

I am mindful that there is a high possibility of further instances of smoke load to continue to occur so I am trying to find ways to best manage the conditions.

I have been in communication with facilities who have advised that they would be attending air quality testing in our area today.

I will check if facilities have any further measures to seal the windows more effectively. I will also raise with them the observation that there is inconsistency with closure of Building 6 windows – ie today a number of ground level windows are open, this has also occurred on other levels on other days.

Feedback received in regards to the two ventilator houses

North Complex House:

Nil current issues with smoke load – the house is airconditioned and the patient is reported to be comfortable with nil respiratory issues at present.

South Complex House:

Night Duty staff reported this morning that there were significant issues with the ducted evaporative cooling system unusable/unsafe, drawing too much smoke into the home, making it dangerous for the client, family and staff alike. The family have purchased and installed an Air Conditioner into the sliding door unit in the family room. The cool air blows directly towards patient's room and makes the staff desk and work area safe and cool, so the staff feel that the situation is being well managed for now. They note that this has meant that the designated emergency exit has

been amended to the back door or front door until the smoke emergency passes, and the temporary reverse cycle air conditioner can be removed.

Further to the advice that has been sent out from the Head of Service in relation to employee assistance resources during the state of alert, I am writing with information that may apply to eligible staff.

Eligible staff can access a few additional leave entitlements other than annual or long service leave. These are listed below.

Reserve Leave

What is it and who is eligible for the leave?

This leave is available to employees (other than casual employees) to enable them to undertake specified defence service and, also, enlistment, training and/or deployment with the Australian Defence Force Reserve (ADFR).

What is the entitlement?

An employee is entitled to ADF Reserve Leave with pay, for up to four weeks during each financial year for the purpose of fulfilling service in the ADF Reserve and Continuous Full Time Service (CFTS) or Cadet Force obligations.

The entitlement to leave for Reserve Service is prescribed under the Defence Reserve Service (Protection) Act 2001.

Can I take other leave if I am deployed for more than four weeks?

An eligible employee may also apply for Annual Leave, Long Service Leave, leave without pay, or they may use Accrued Day Off or flextime (where available) to make up time for the purpose of fulfilling ADF Reserve, CFTS or Cadet Force obligations.

How do I apply?

An eligible employee must give notice to the head of service as soon as practicable of their absence or intention to be absent for Defence Reserve Leave, including documentary evidence.

Other conditions/information

Employees are not required to pay their tax-free ADF Reserve salary to the ACTPS in any circumstances.

Defence Reserve Leave counts as service for all purposes, except for unpaid leave to undertake CFTS. Unpaid leave for the purpose of CFTS counts for all purposes except Annual Leave.

Community Service Leave

In this instance there are two types of Community Service leave that are available to staff:

Voluntary Emergency Management

What is it and who is eligible for the leave?

An employee who is a member of a relevant emergency service, including:

- a. a State or Territory Emergency Service;
- b. a fire-fighting service;
- c. a search and rescue unit; or
- d. other volunteer service performing similar functions

is eligible for community service leave for voluntary emergency management.

What is the entitlement?

Subject to operational requirements, employees (other than casual employees) are entitled to up to four days paid community service leave for voluntary emergency manager per emergency. A casual employee who is a member of a relevant emergency service is eligible for unpaid community service leave for voluntary emergency management service.

How do I apply?

Employees need to discuss their intention and the length of time they intend to be absent as soon as practicable and make an application to the relevant delegate for approval. If required documentary evidence must be provided.

Can I take other leave if I am going to be absent for more than four days?

Additional paid leave may be approved by a delegate for any voluntary emergency management duties required to be performed by an employee who is a member of a State or Territory Emergency Service.

Voluntary Community Service

What is it and who is eligible for the leave?

Community Service leave is for voluntary community service to engage in a recognised voluntary community service activity.

What is the entitlement?

Subject to operational requirements, employees (other than casual employees) are entitled to up to three days paid community service leave within a twelve-month period.

How do I apply?

Employees need to discuss their intention and the length of time they intend to be absent as soon as practicable and make an application to the relevant delegate for approval. If required documentary evidence must be provided.

Can I take other leave if I am going to be absent for more than three days?

Annual leave and long service leave can be taken in addition to this leave, unpaid community service leave can also be granted.

Other conditions/information

In considering an application from an employee for paid leave to engage in a voluntary community service activity, the head of service must consider whether:

- a. the activity is a recognised voluntary activity; and
- the community organisation or project is an acceptable organisation or project as defined in the employee's Directorate guidelines; and
- there is a risk the activity would place the employee in a real or perceived conflict of interest.

Leave for a voluntary community service activity must not be approved for activities which:

- a. involve any payment in cash or kind for the duties performed by the employee; or
- b. replace work ordinarily undertaken by a paid worker; or
- c. are undertaken solely for direct personal benefit of the employee; or
- d. place the employee in a conflict of interest situation; or
- e. are primarily focussed on promoting particular religious or political views; or
- f. involves work which does not have a community focus.

Cope with a disaster

What is it and who is eligible for the leave?

Where an employee is affected by a disaster which has destroyed or significantly damaged the employee's usual place of residence or its contents.

What is the entitlement?

A maximum period of three days in each consecutive 12-month period.

How do I apply?

Employees need to discuss their intention and the length of time they intend to be absent as soon as practicable and make an application to the relevant delegate for approval. If required documentary evidence must be provided.

Can I take other leave if I am going to be absent for more than three days? Annual leave and long service leave can be taken in addition to this leave.

Personal leave in Extraordinary and Unforeseen Circumstances

What is it and who is eligible for the leave?

Employees, other than causals, are eligible for personal leave in extraordinary or unforeseen circumstances (i.e. national disaster) and it is essential the employee must have leave from the workplace.

What is the entitlement?

The head of service may grant with pay up to a maximum of four days personal leave. These four days are in addition to the seven days personal leave without documentary evidence.

How do I apply?

Employees need to discuss their intention and the length of time they intend to be absent as soon as practicable and make an application to the relevant delegate for approval. If required documentary evidence must be provided.

Can I take other leave if I am going to be absent for more than three days? Annual leave and long service leave can be taken in addition to this leave.

What happens if I am called into work?

What is the entitlement?

For staff who are called into work when they would normally not attend work are eligible to receive payment at overtime rates. Overtime (up to a Senior Officer Grade C) for the period they attend, or if the manager/supervisor and the employee agrees, take time in lieu.

Overtime for staff who are employed at the Senior Officer Grade if approved is only paid at the top increment of the ASO6 salary.

How do I claim the overtime/TOIL?

To claim the overtime an overtime form must be submitted by the employee and submitted to their delegate for approval.

Recovery after overtime

Unless the head of service directs, employees are entitled to be absent from work for a period of eight hours including reasonable travel time without loss of pay.

Please note that the Employee Advocate works Monday – Thursday.

Finally, I encourage any employee who needs additional support to seek help early from the range of support options available.

Subject: Mental health response to bushfires

Hello Michael and Bernadette

Hope you both had some time off over the festive season – with the bushfires and the State of Alert, the year has certainly started at a pace...

I want to seek your views on putting together a mental health response to the bushfire situation.

My broad thinking is that we have a few groups of people that we need to be aware of – those who have returned from the coast having potentially experienced some reasonably traumatic events, and those for whom the current events are creating anxiety based on an ongoing reaction to the events in Canberra in 2003. This second group's situation may be exacerbated if we end up with the fires to our west reaching in to the ACT.

I spoke with Elizabeth briefly on Sunday, and she pointed me in the direction of the ANU resource for dealing with trauma for children – linked here: https://emergingminds.com.au/resources/toolkits/community-trauma-toolkit/

My current thinking is that we should work with PICC and our own Health Comms team to highlight the availability of this, starting in the coming days. This would need further discussion on the best comms channels.

The second step I have in mind is putting together some 'town hall' style public information sessions where some appropriate people from ACT Health/CHS present in broad terms about how to cope with the various emotions people are feeling. Obviously we don't have the capacity to offer individualised support for everybody, but some broad scale 'training' with direction to further resources could be beneficial and reassuring for the community. I am mindful of the two similar sessions I have seen in recent years (one presented by Carers ACT and one by the Catholic Schools Assoc) where experts have given parents a range of ideas and tools that has left them feeling empowered to guide their children. I think we would want to offer these sessions reasonably soon, and perhaps have three or four in different districts across Canberra?

So I would welcome your feedback on this approach or whether there are other ideas we could apply to respond to the level of anxiety and perhaps trauma that has been generated in the community.

Hi,

I am writing this email on behalf of the Phillip Community Nursing staff (at the very least). I'm sure you are aware of the health effects that ongoing poor air quality has been having on the community staff; for example, I have spoken to a number of staff who have been complaining of symptoms including sore throats, coughing, burning/watery eyes and headaches. If you are not aware, as part of our home visits, we exit and enter a car before and after each visit, but this may also include also going to the car on occasion to collect supplies for patients. Some of these houses also lack appropriate ventilation or cooling.

Whilst the conditions have seemingly improved today, according to the ACT Health website, the air quality is still hazardously high to hazardously extreme, which states that "Anyone experiencing symptoms which may be due to smoke exposure should consider taking a break away from the smoky conditions".

Whilst I am aware that the Canberra Health Service have been providing updates on the situation, I feel that most of the Community Nursing staff feel that this advice is being directed at those within the Canberra Health buildings. I am also aware that many of our managers are currently on leave, however, there has been no directive as to how much time we can safely be outside for nor how we are to manage outdoor smoke exposure whilst working.

We understand that patient care and welfare is important and we are more than willing to continue to work in the current conditions. It would just be appreciated if further guidance was provided so that our staff don't become unwell. If it helps at all, I did a quick Google search and found a number of online documents from the US and Canada for employers on managing wildfire smoke (sorry- I have a Master in Public Health)!

Anyway, no need to answer me personally, but thank you for your time.

Dear Directors-General

As discussed at SEMSOG to support the management of employee wellbeing including in relation to air quality CMTEDD has prepared guidance material for your consideration and use in communication to your respective workforces (see attached):

- Guidance for managers regarding staff wellbeing and air quality issues
- Quick Reference Guide Daily Outdoor Air Quality Risk Assessment

It is not possible to provide specific guidance on the length of time employees may work outdoors at any given time as it is dependent on a range of variables. These include the nature of the activity, temperature, access to rest and daily changes to air quality. Risk assessments of critical outdoor functions will need to be undertaken on an ongoing basis.

Below also is State and Territory Chief Health Officers statement on air quality and masks:

The internal air quality in modern well ventilated office buildings is better than that externally and in many circumstances, better than that in people's homes.

People and workplaces need to make their own determination on specific circumstances affecting their workplace and staff.

In some work situations, where more modern ventilation systems in particular buildings are available and internal air quality is particularly affected, staff may want to consider relocation to other buildings. This should only be done in consultation with workplace supervisors. Individual work units should examine their particular situations.

Vulnerable people should take advice from their medical practitioners.

P2 masks are not recommended for general use by public service staff. The use of P2 masks should be limited to vulnerable people including those with significant health issues and for people who are working outside for significant periods of time.

Those most at risk of significant health effects of smoke include people over 65 years of age, pregnant women and people with existing heart or lung condition, including asthma and those with diabetes.

P2 masks have limited utility for extended periods and should only be used on the advice of your medical practitioner or a health professional."

I trust this information provides some assistance.

Guidance for Directorates - Employee wellbeing and air quality

This guidance has been developed to provide directorates with background information and options available to them to manage the health and wellbeing of their staff during periods of poor air quality due to bushfire smoke.

Each directorate should determine the most suitable work arrangements for their staff each day or more frequently if circumstances change, based on this guidance.

Outdoor work activities

CMTEED has developed a Quick Reference Guide (QRG) to assist with risk assessment of outdoor work activities (Attachment 1).

As we have such a diverse range of outdoor work across the ACTPS, the intent of the QRG is to provide work groups with a guidance framework to enable them to assess risk and identify real time hazard and mitigation controls. This must be undertaken on a regular basis, such as daily, or when conditions change during a work activity. The hazard identification and risk controls must be considered prior to commencing each work activity and be available for referencing during outdoor work activities.

The QRG is designed to provide additional guidance to existing tools within the ACT framework for reference, specifically the <u>ACT Health advice</u> table for smoky air and the Multiple Hazard Risk Assessment tool located within the ACTPS WHSMS framework of procedures, templates and tools.

Indoor air quality

The internal air quality in modern well-ventilated office buildings is generally better than that externally and, in many circumstances, better than that in people's homes.

Directorate corporate teams are continuously working with ACT Property Group and building managers to ensure areas of concern, where identified, are addressed as effectively as possible.

In some buildings, where more modern ventilation systems are available and internal air quality is particularly affected, staff may want to consider relocation to other buildings or utilising flexible working arrangements where feasible and appropriate. This should only be done in consultation with workplace supervisors. Vulnerable people should take advice from their medical practitioners.

Requests to work from home or another location

Given the current environmental conditions, some staff may ask to work from home or another location.

As a manager, you need to be satisfied that the employee will be in a safe and healthy work environment. Given the current exceptional circumstances, they should be asked:

- How smoke affected is their house or proposed work location?
- Do they have an air conditioner which can be set to recycle?
- Do they have other protections such as an air purifier?
- Do they have a health condition that increases your vulnerability to air quality issues?
- Have they completed the <u>Workstation Self-Assessment Checklist</u> and found their proposed work environment to be suitable?

Managers can approve work from home or an alternative location if they are satisfied that all the relevant risks have been identified and that appropriate mitigations strategies have successfully been put into place.

If you have any concerns or doubts with the proposed arrangements, then they should not be approved, and an alternate work location should be arranged.

P2 masks

The use of P2 masks should be limited to vulnerable people including those with significant health issues and for people who are working outside for significant periods of time.

Those most at risk of significant health effects of smoke include people over 65 years of age, pregnant women and people with existing heart or lung condition, including asthma and those with diabetes.

P2 masks have limited utility for extended periods and should only be used on the advice of your medical practitioner or a health professional.

Leave options for illness and caring responsibilities

Staff who are unwell as a result of the smoke or otherwise, should firstly be encouraged to seek their own medical advice and to follow that advice. They should also consult with their manager regarding their concerns and in finding alternative work or leave arrangements.

Any staff who may be particularly vulnerable to health effect of smoke should be encouraged to seek and follow advice from their medical practitioner.

Staff with caring responsibilities that prevent them from working on the day should apply for carers' leave as usual. This includes caring for immediate family or household members, or those related by Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander kinship structures who have been affected by the bushfires.

If staff have exhausted their personal leave entitlements, they may access Annual or Long Service Leave where available. Staff with limited or expended leave accruals should contact directorate HR teams to discuss options.

Leave options for Community Service and Reservist duties

Various types of leave are available to staff to carry out community service and Australian Defence Force Reservist duties. The leave categories in the table below can be applied for via the Shared Services portal.

Additional leave options

Staff can also apply for personal leave in extraordinary and unforeseen circumstances for reasons other than for personal illness or caring responsibilities. This category of leave is applicable where it is essential for an employee to be absent from the workplace due to extraordinary, unforeseen or unexpected circumstances.

This type of leave will be granted with pay and is deducted from the staff member's personal leave balance.

An employee who is affected by a disaster which has destroyed or significantly damaged the employee's usual place of residence, or its contents, can apply for 'Cope with a Disaster' leave via the Shared Services portal under 'Other Leave'.

Quick Reference Guide (QRG) Daily Outdoor Air Quality Risk Assessment

Below is the proposed guidance framework to identify, mitigate and risk assess in conjunction with workers the hazard exposure associated with poor air quality and impacts inclusive of working in heat prior to commencing outdoor work activities.

Guidance note: Persons at potential risk due to poor air quality and working in heat include but are not limited to:

- People prone to respiratory conditions inclusive of eye and respiratory tract irritation to disorders such as breathing problems, bronchitis, increased severity of asthma
- · pre-existing cardiovascular conditions
- · pre-existing heart and lung problems
- People over 65, children 14 years and younger, pregnant women

Risk Assessment Guideline:

(a) Identify the outdoor air quality level (PM_{2.5} concentration) from the nearest air quality station (Monash,
Florey or Civic) and compare with the relevant <u>ACT Health advisory</u> categories for smoky air
 (b) Review the daily temperature forecast via the <u>Bureau of Meteorology</u> (BOM) site.

Once air quality level has been established, temperature, wind and weather conditions identified:

- 2. Complete the Multiple Hazard Risk Assessment tool daily in conjunction with the workgroup, consideration to be given to the following components:
- Hazard identification
 - Type of outdoor work activity (essential/critical/non-essential etc.)
 - Nature of outdoor work activity (strenuous, low physical impact i.e. passive etc.)
 - Hazard/s associated with specific outdoor work activity (air quality, working in heat etc.)
- Dose-response assessment
 - Temperature forecast working in heat controls to capture heightened risk of heat stress/stroke
 - Air quality PM2.5 concentration to guide mitigation controls inclusive of levels of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) such as respiratory, eye etc.
 - Age (over 65) and health status of the outdoor work group (pre-existing health issues respiratory, heart, lung, asthmatic, cardiovascular disease, pregnancy etc.)
- Exposure assessment
 - time/duration of exposure (to be based on the above identified "type, nature, hazard/s" specific to the work activity)
- Risk estimation and characterisation

If the work is not essential then consider re-scheduling or postponing (i.e. eliminate the risk). If the work/activity is essential and must proceed, be specific and clarify identified controls required:

- Specific type and level of identified Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)
- o Defined heat/air quality exposure duration/s (time in field), job rotation timeframes etc.
- Ongoing air quality monitoring plan for duration of work (i.e. monitor and check website hourly)
- Specific controls (where identified) for scheduled activity breaks for workers, availability of rest areas, access to cool fresh water, increased First Aid, Medical equipment or resources and/or arrangements in addition to existing Emergency Management Plans
- Protocols to cover further deterioration of conditions or introduction of new hazards (dust, fire, low visibility, increase in wind etc.) including monitoring methodology and supervision, review and communication with affected workers
- Worker self-management protocols (i.e. agreed processes for workers to cease work if uncomfortable or at onset of adverse symptoms)
- Factor in uncertainty
 - Alternative agreed work arrangements
 - Ensure work group give due consideration to any/all potential new hazards that can foreseeably be introduced from deteriorating or changing conditions impacted by heat and/or air quality.
