DECISION ON YOUR ACCESS APPLICATION

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (FOI Act), received by ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) on **Wednesday 17 May 2023**.

This application requested access to:

'All briefs, minutes and reports provided to the Health Minister, Director-General of ACT Health and/or CEO of Canberra Health Services since my last FOI request (ACTHDFOI22-23.39), on implementation issues in connection with the Digital Health Record, including any bugs, technical challenges, 'code reds' or security issues.'

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General of ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) under section 18 of the FOI Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act. ACTHD was required to provide a decision on your access application by **Friday 16 June 2023**.

I have identified one document holding the information within scope of your access application.

Decisions

I have decided to grant full access to one document.

In reaching my access decision, I have taken the following into account:

- The FOI Act; and
- The contents of the documents that fall within the scope of your request.

Charges



Digital Health Record Outage

- On Wednesday, 26 April 2023 the Digital Health Record experienced an outage that impacted all health systems within the Nippon Telegraph and Telephone (NTT) environment. The outage occurred at 8:45am and was resolved by 11:46am. Canberra Health Services (CHS) promptly switched over to Business Continuity Process mode, whilst the teams worked closely with CHS to manage the incident.
- 2. After careful analysis, the root cause was found to be an issue with the NTT Protected Government Cloud that enables the Domain controllers and Domain Name Servers to authenticate users entering the system. Communication between the sites was highly effective and was resolved within 4 hours.

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
